Combined reports show 57 per cent Eisenhower, 28 per cent Stevenson, 15 per cent undecided. SISTERS SPOONBURGER CASSEROLE

All measurements are level. Sift flour before measuring

In a heated skillet (9 or 10-inch diameter) place—

- 2 tablespoons drippings, or cooking oil
- 1 large onion, sliced
- 1 pound ground beef (2 cups)

Fry until meat is browned and onion soft. Add—

- 1 cup tomato hot sauce (8 oz. can)
- 1 cup water
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon mustard (dry or prepared)
- 1 teaspoon chili powder
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1/4 cup sweet pickle relish

Stir to blend ingredients, then bring to a boil. Turn into a 1 1/2 or 2-quart casserole (or use skillet in which mixture is cooking).
