Musial, Doby Wearing '52 Bat Crowns

NEW YORK — Stan Musial of the St. Louis Cardinals and Cleveland's Larry Doby are wearing the 1952 major league slugging crowns.

Final figures calculated by the Associated Press reveal that Musial accumulated 311 total bases in 578 at bats to pace the National League sluggers with a .538 average. Doby, producing 281 total bases in 519 trips to the plate, topped the American League with a .541 slugging percentage.

For Musial, who owns the highest lifetime slugging percentage in National League history, .570, this was his fifth slugging championship. The slender outfielder-first baseman captured the title in 1943, 1946, 1948 and 1950.

The 31-year-old prolific swinger also won his sixth batting crown with a .336 average and led in total bases for the fourth time in his career.

Doby, a 27-year-old flycatcher, was hampered slightly at the outset by a leg ailment, but he gained momentum as the season progressed. The powerful Tribesman found the range to take the home run title and tie for the runner-up spot in the runs batted in department.

Hank Sauer of the Chicago Cubs finished right behind Musial for National League slugging supremacy with a mark of .529. The husky Young Mickey Mantle of the Yankees gained runner-up honors in the American League slugging standings with a .528 percentage achieved in 290 total bases in 549 trips.

NCAA Suspects 10 As Violators

CHICAGO — The National Collegiate Athletic Association, revealing that 10 schools are being investigated as code violators of varying degrees, will wind up a four-day parley Thursday that paves the way to the group's national convention in January.

The closing session of the NCAA policy-directing council is expected to include a report on Television. Hugh C. Willett of Southern California, NCAA president, said he did not know if the TV committee will submit a 1953 program at this time.

Identity of the 10 colleges and universities accused of violations is being withheld. Cases against three of them have progressed to a point where the council is considering recommendation of disciplinary measures to the association's convention at Washington, D. C., Jan. 8-10.

One of the three is reported to be the University of Kentucky, involved in the recently-exposed basketball scandal.

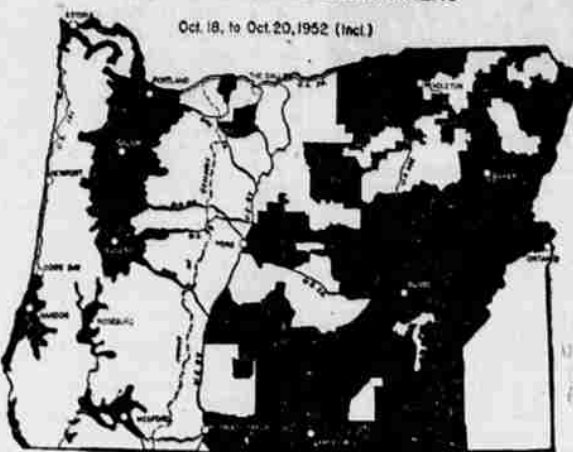
The council approved a subcommittee report suggesting that the enforcement of rules and regulations "can best be met, and is most needed, at the institutional level."

7 OF 12 IN FIRST YEAR

BROOKLYN, N. Y. — The Brooklyn Dodgers fought down the National League pennant stretch with 12 pitchers. Seven of them were first year men, otherwise known as rookies. Only pitchers with a full year's previous experience in the majors were Preacher Roe, Ralph Branca, Carl Erskine and Clyde King. Clem Labine could be classified as a veteran although he wasn't brought up until late in 1951.

State Hunters' Choice Deer Season Will Open Saturday

The hunter's choice deer season aimed at cropping deer from agricultural areas and problem deer ranges will be held Saturday, Sunday, and Monday, Oct. 18 to 20, but only hunters with unused deer tags may participate.

Only hunter's choice season change made by the game commission was the closure of the mule deer game refuge located west of Lakeview in the Fremont national forest.

The Whitetail Deer Refuge is closed during "hunter's choice" deer season, Oct. 18, 19 and 20, according to J. W. Vaughn, regional supervisor for the State Game Commission at Roseburg.

The rest of Douglas County, according to Vaughn, will be open outside the exterior boundaries of National Forests, or on or within one mile of currently cultivated lands, except that part of Douglas County lying north of Highway 38 and west of Highway 99.

In western Oregon the hunter's choice season will be outside national forest boundaries and within one mile of cultivated agricultural lands, thus offering protection to non-problem deer on the higher ranges. Lincoln and Tillamook counties are closed.

With the exception of Hood River valley and White river valley (Wasco county), the hunter's choice area in eastern Oregon lies east of the Dalles-California highway and the Jefferson, Wasco, and Gilliam county lines.

The greater part of central and southeastern Oregon are included in the either-sex area, but Malheur county south of Highway 20; all of Umatilla national forest; portions of all other eastern Oregon national forests including the Canyon Creek

SC Works On Blocking For Duck Contest Sat.

LOS ANGELES — Southern California's Trojan football machine gets a final going over from Coach Jess Hill Thursday before taking off for Portland to play Oregon State in a Coast Conference game Saturday.

Hill apparently still isn't satisfied with his line blocking on offense and reportedly has been re-shuffling his talent in an effort to improve the Trojan attack.

Scout reports confirmed what everyone figured to begin with, namely, that fullback Sam Baker is the big wheel to watch for Oregon State.

Shaw, Baker All-American Possibles

LOS ANGELES — Don Heinrich of Washington, George Shaw of Oregon and Sam Baker of Oregon State have been nominated for possible All-America football consideration.

The three-man panel representing the Coast Conference in the Associated Press' nationwide board of selectors proposed the three Northwest stars Wednesday along with Johnny Olszewski of California, Donn Moomaw and Terry DeWay of UCLA, and Elmer Willhoite and Bob Hooks of Southern California.

Members of the board are Royal Brougham, of the Seattle Post-Intelligencer, Bill Leiser of the San Francisco Chronicle, and Paul B. Zimmerman of the Los Angeles Times.

Olszewski, an All-America candidate last year until forced out of action by injuries, was the only one of the group nominated by two of the selectors.

Heinrich, named to the 1950 All-America team, was smothered by Illinois last week but still leads the nation in yards gained through the air with 719.

Baker is the nation's No. 1 punter, with a 44.9 average, and ranks No. 5 in rushing in the Coast Conference.

Shaw, an all-around handyman at Oregon, cracked Heinrich's conference record last week when he completed 2 out of 50 passes for 244 yards against California.

Ross Miller Sets Opening Of His Service Station

Formal opening of the Ross Miller Mobil Super Service Station at 1602 Harvard Ave., at Maple, is scheduled for Friday and Saturday of this week.

With his wife and 6-year-old son, he is presently residing in Cloverdale.

Assisting Miller will be Bob Esary of Lookingglass. He is married and has two children. He, too, has had service station experience.

Miller said the station has installed the latest equipment and has blacktop and cement parkway. Gardening for the women and treats for the children will be given away the two opening days.

Stengel 'Manager Of Year'

NEW YORK — Charles Dillon Stengel, has been honored for the miracle everyone figured he would pull off — by being named Manager of the Year for the second time.

The "old perferer" was named on 37 of the 72 ballots cast by Baseball Writers in the Associated Press poll. The honor climaxed a season for the 61-year-old Glendale, Calif., seer in which he won his fourth straight pennant and world championship to tie a record held only by Joe McCarthy, another Yankee manager.

Even more surprising than Stengel's naming was the runner-up position which went to Eddie Stanky in his first year as a major league pilot. Eddie brought a "fair to middling" St. Louis Cardinal squad home third in the National League race.
