Beavers Working To Split SC's Defense In Contest Saturday

Without leaving a stone unturned, Coach Kip Taylor sent his Oregon State football team through its toughest grind of the 1952 season this week as the Beavers prepared to clash with the touted Trojans of Southern California.

The 64 dollar question in the minds of most fans is—"Can Oregon State split Southern Cal's sturdy defense which has limited four opponents to a total of 13 points.

Taylor has been attempting to cook up an answer for this question, sending his squad through lengthy scrimmage sessions Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday before slacking off Thursday. A light drill was also planned for Friday.

Jess Hill's Trojans have limited their first four opponents to an average of 204 net yards per game to take the lead in the total defense department among PCC teams. The SC eleven has especially shined on pass defense. Southern Cal's opposition has managed to average only 68.3 yards per game through the air.

On the other hand, the Taylor-men outrank Troy in the offensive department with an average of 310 yards per contest as to USC's 220. Thus, according to statistics at least, Oregon State's hope for victory rests in its ability to smack through the Trojan defenses.

Cal Moore, 240-pound right guard, may not be ready for full time duty Saturday because of a knee injury. Otherwise, the Orange squad is ready. Moore suffered a knee injury at Palo Alto and will be held to limited action.

Halfbacks Jack Pinion and Jack Peterson have both been pronounced ready for the Portland encounter. Although not fully recovered from a bad back last Saturday, Pinion saw action against Stanford while Peterson, who has been nursing a pulled leg muscle, didn't even make the trip.

OSC Rated Underdog Team

PORTLAND (AP) — Oregon State and Southern California football teams, slated to meet here in a Pacific Coast Conference thriller Saturday, were due here Friday for light pre-game workouts in Multnomah Stadium.

Oregon State, rated as the underdog team, held its final camp workout at Corvallis Thursday.

Southern Cal is given a two-touchdown edge over the Beavers Saturday. Beaver supporters point out, however, the Trojans lost in their last two appearances in the Stadium here.

A half-dozen crucial district games this week end will narrow the field in the Oregon high school chase for football titles.

A Southern Oregon contest pitting Klamath Falls, the state's No. 3 team in the latest Associated Press poll, against Medford will draw perhaps the most interest. Klamath Falls is favored, and a victory would put the team a long way toward the district 5 title in class 1.

Hillsboro, rated No. 5 in the state, could take undisputed lead in district 4 by downing Oregon City, but that may take some doing. Oregon City has lost only one game this season, that one to tough Gresham in a nine-district encounter, 14-7.

Baker, the No. 8 team, also could move out in front in district 7 by downing its closest competitor, The Dalles. That game may decide the Blue Mountain League race.

A Portland contest sends two of the state's better teams into action. Franklin, rated No. 6, tangles with Jefferson, rated No. 10. The victor will have an inside track for one of the city's two positions in the coming state playoffs. Grant, rated No. 4 in the state, also meets a rough opponent, Cleveland.

Marshfield, the state's No. 1 team, draws a breather, playing Reedsport in a non-district game. Central Catholic of Portland, the No. 2 team, also is expected to win with ease from Parkrose in a

Cal End Coach Quitting Because Ball 'On Way Out'

BERKELEY, Calif. (AP) — Edgar (Egg) Manske, who's played or coached football two-thirds of his 40 years, said Friday he's quitting as end coach at undefeated California after this season "because de-emphasis is inevitable."

"College football is on its way out," he declared. "There is no future in the game, even for a head coach."

"For the present, college presidents are tolerating big time football. But they don't like it, and eventually they'll get what they want."

Lynn (Pappy) Waldorf, head coach of California's No. 3 rated team in the Associated Press poll, disagreed.

He also said Manske frequently talks of quitting, but has remained—and "I hope he changes his mind again. He's a good man and I'd hate to lose him."

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
