Enlarged crews appeared to be gaining the upper hand on major blazes in Washington and Oregon Friday, but foresters said they were still out of control and warned it will take soaking rains to quench the fires and end fire dangers in tinder-dry woods.

More than 500 men were in the lines battling the worst fire — a 3,500-acre blaze in the Olympic National Forest, 40 miles west of Port Angeles — and additional help was being sought.

In Oregon, five fires were still out of control on Mt. Hood, but spread of the flames, which had burned about 1,200 acres, was being slowed by cool breezes from the west.

Realizing that a "lost wheel" last Sunday might have caused injury to dozens of unprotected spectators, and given the sport a black eye, the Management refused to allow another meet until proper measures are taken.

We have made arrangements with a responsible contractor to remodel the track and set up ample protection to spectators. The track as envisaged for the regular season next summer will have a covered grandstand, fronted by a reinforced concrete retaining wall, making it the safest and best meet in Oregon.

The Management believes that full consideration of these points will prove to honest enthusiasts that the best interests of the association will be served by placing safety first.
