

CHESTER, Calif. (U—) A grim, 300-man posse broke up a fearful search early Saturday after a missing threesome, two men and a 2-year-old girl, turned up safely.

The possibility of a repetition of the robbery-massacre of a grocer and three children hung darkly over the early-morning hunt.

The three were believed to have gone to an out-of-town movie. They didn't come home on time.

A frightened, almost-hysterical wife and mother called the sheriff.

All available officers and lumbermen armed with shotguns and deer rifles to search on foot along the 14-mile highway to Westwood and the movie.

It was the same road the grocer and three children had ridden to their deaths only last week.

But this time it was only a mistake.

Carol Jean Hawkins, her millworker father Leonard Hawkins, 24, and his brother-in-law Don McLaughlin, all of Chester, had driven to Redding — about 104 miles away—and had a car breakdown on their return.

"I can't hear you," Miss Everett said.

"This gun does my talking for me and I can use it," spoke up the robber.

The teller filled the bag with approximately \$1,000, and "Grandma" walked to the door and disappeared into a crowd.
