Suit Asks Right To Return Money

A law suit with a twist was filed Thursday in Circuit Court.

Lodovico and Lena Calenzani, operators of the Southern Douglas Garbage Service and plaintiffs in the action, are asking the defendants to accept a \$9,494.71 payment to settle demands arising out of negotiations for purchase of the garbage service.

Defendants in the suit are Lester A. and Josephine White, who had negotiated for purchase of the service and had operated it from May through July, according to the complaint.

Last Aug. 1, however, the Whites decided they didn't want to purchase the company and turned back the equipment.

The Calenzanis' complaint also asks that the defendants cease competing with the plaintiffs in the garbage collection business in the south Douglas County area. The complaint alleges the Whites have "engaged in a competing business with the plaintiffs, using the information and contacts the defendants gained during the operation of plaintiff's business."

'Y' Leader From India Dates Talks in Roseburg

The founder and director of the YMCA Boys Town in Madras, India—Lawrence C. Burr—will be in Roseburg Tuesday for two speeches.

He'll talk before the Roseburg Kiwanis Club at a noon luncheon in the Umpqua Hotel, then speak following a 3:30 p.m. Hi-Y and Tri Hi-Y induction service at the First Baptist Church.

Home on furlough after five years in India, Burr's first assignment abroad was to help Indian "Y" leaders develop programs for boys. He worked particularly with the underprivileged, searching the streets at night for youths to bring into YMCA care.

Besides launching Boys Town, the YMCA worker was the first to organize Hi-Y clubs in the Indian schools. He helped develop camping and the regular city YM program. The Y furnishes about the only place where Moslems, Hindus, Sikhs, Parsis and Christians can work and play together.

The 38-year-old YM worker started his career as a "Y" secretary during student days at Langston University, Oklahoma. He served as Oklahoma state director of the National Youth Administration and superintendent of the Oklahoma State Institute for the Deaf, Blind and Orphans.

From 1942 to the time of his overseas appointment in 1946, Burr was community boys' secretary at a Chicago YM branch. A Hi-Y movement was launched in the city schools there under his direction.

Myrtle Creek Civil Defense Head Named

New post supervisor for the Myrtle Creek civil defense set-up is Rev. J. E. Kratz. His job will be to organize air watches as part of the state air warning system.

A call will soon be issued for volunteers for three to five hours of air watch service a week.

A 24-hour plane watch operation is already underway in Canyonville under the supervision of C. E. Park. Volunteers man the watch by day, with police taking over at night.

Boy Falls From Car; Injuries Not Serious

Near tragedy struck the George B. Fox family of Glendale again last Sunday when their son, Stevie, fell from the family car when they were returning from church.

Stevie, nearly three years old, suffered a slight brain concussion in addition to cuts and bruises.

He is making a very good recovery, the family reports.

Only two weeks before this, the Fox's son, Gerald Geoffrey, died while undergoing an operation. His heart stopped beating and his doctor spent the whole night massaging his heart by hand. He died in an ambulance enroute to the Glendale Airport where a mercy plane was to take him to Portland.

Stevie Fox's doctor ordered him to "keep very quiet for 48 hours and as quiet as possible the rest of the week." His excellent recovery has made a thankful family very happy to see him "too frisky to appreciate the doctor's orders."

Mrs. George B. Fox is the News-Review correspondent for the Glendale-Astoria area. She reported that "it is a little hard on news gathering. Daddy had the whole job to do by himself and couldn't get all the way around."

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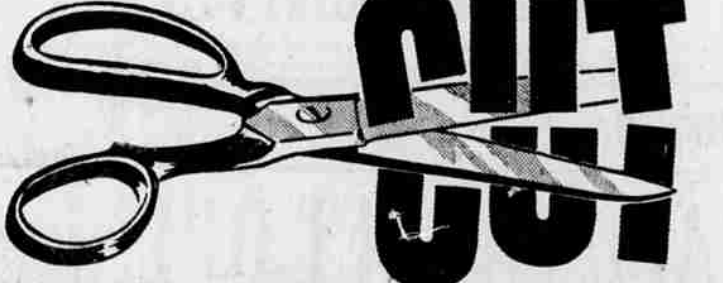
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
