Klamath Falls Eyes Clues In Hunt For Lost Plane

KLAMATH FALLS (AP)—The painstaking task of checking out small clues was continued here Thursday in the hunt for a plane missing since Saturday somewhere between Redmond and Medford.

Missing are Mr. and Mrs. Everett Logan of Yakima.

Yakima and local men set up two advanced ground camps in the rough, heavily timbered area of Lake of the Woods and Dead Indian Creek, west of here.

The timber is too thick for aerial searchers to spot small plane wreckage, so ground parties are relied on for checking clues.

Escapes Who Beat Klamath Jailer Give Up

KLAMATH FALLS (AP)—Two prisoners severely beat an elderly jailer and escaped from the Klamath County jail Tuesday night. They surrendered a few hours later.

Sheriff Murray Britton said John H. Brandon, 26, and Robert Kral, 18, attacked Jailer Sherman Kettenberg, 61, as he opened the door to the main cell block about 7 p.m. Brandon then beat Kettenberg with his fist, then the two beat him about the head with a blackjack made of a sock filled with bars of soap, Britton said.

They took the jailer's keys, unlocked the outer doors and fled. State police and railroad detectives joined sheriff's officers in a hunt for the escaped pair.

About 9:30 p.m. a woman living in suburban Klamath Falls phoned the sheriff's office that a man had come to her house and asked her to notify officers. It turned out to be Brandon.

An hour later, Kral's mother phoned from her Klamath Falls home that her son was ready to surrender.

Kral was convicted of contributing to the delinquency of a minor and Brandon was a trusty from McNeil Island federal penitentiary who had been working at the Tulare prison camp. He was awaiting return to McNeil. Brandon was convicted in Alameda County, Calif., of theft of a check from the mails.

Kettenberg was reported "getting along fairly well" at a hospital here.

Boy, 2, Playing With Pistol, Shoots Mother

PHILADELPHIA (AP)—Police said Mrs. Helen Lisiecki, 26, was shot and seriously wounded by her two-year-old son, Paul Tuesday night while he was playing with his grandfather's pistol.

The mother was in the bathroom when Paul walked in holding the .32 caliber weapon, police said. He pointed it at his mother playfully. The next instant the weapon went off.

Police said the bullet hit her in the left chest, took an upward course, and lodged in the back. She was taken to Temple University hospital. Physicians reported her condition as good.

'Wetbacks,' Some From Oregon, Sent To Mexico

SEATTLE (AP)—It's "South of the border" again for 550 Mexican "wetbacks" caught in a special roundup in Washington, Oregon and Idaho, District Immigration Director John P. Boyd said Wednesday.

Two border patrol units came north for the drive. Three hundred were taken into custody in Oregon, 75 in Eastern Washington and 175 in Central and Southern Idaho and each man was given a hearing, Boyd said.

They are being moved by train and chartered buses.
