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Marshfield, Eugene Vie In 'Big' One

Five big games dominate high school football in Oregon this week end, and the biggest of all will be at Eugene.

There the state's No. 1 team, Marshfield, unbeaten in six consecutive games, will tangle with Eugene, the state's No. 8 team in the latest Associated Press poll.

The game probably will determine which team enters the state playoffs at the district 5 representative in class 1.

Eugene has won five games and dropped one, a 20-6 loss to Klamath Falls. Eugene, however, gained a 41-7 victory over Springfield, a team that Marshfield could down only by a 29-14 score.

Marshfield had the edge, though, over two other common opponents. Marshfield downed Cottage Grove, 40-7, and Roseburg, 42-6. Eugene won from Cottage Grove, 18-6, and from Roseburg, 27-0.

Central Oregon also will see a clash featuring two teams from the top 10 in the state. Prineville, No. 7 in the latest poll, will go against Bend, a team that is in a tie for tenth place.

The game does not count in district standings, for Prineville is a class 2 team.

In Eastern Oregon The Dalles, the state's No. 9 team, will tackle La Grande. A win could assure The Dalles at least a tie for the district 7 title in class 1.

Portland will feature two stand-out games that will go a long way toward determining the city's two representatives in the state playoffs.

One sends once-tied Jefferson, No. 5 in the state, against Washington. The other will pit Grant against Franklin. Grant was the state's No. 4 team before an ineligibility ruling cost Grant four victories this week. Grant still is strong and is favored to win over Franklin, materially hurting that team's chance to get into the playoffs.

Still another Portland contest will send Central Catholic, No. 2 in the state, against Columbia Prep in a traditional game, but one that does not count in district standings. Klamath Falls, No. 3 in the state, will be idle, but Hillsboro, the No. 6 team, will play West Linn. North Bend, tied with Bend for tenth place, will meet Roseburg.

In class 2, St. Helens and Rainier will fight it out for the lead in the western division of district 1. The favored Toledo team will meet Siuslaw in district 2. Sheridan, one of the leaders in district 3, will play Sherwood.

The most important game of the season in district 4 will send unbeaten Silverton, the district leader, against Mt. Angel, undefeated but tied once.

In district 6 Ashland is expected to take another step toward the southern division title by getting past Crater.

Beavers Leave Tackle Behind, Head For WSC

CORVALLIS, Ore. (AP) — The Oregon State Beavers left reserve tackle Ernie Madsen behind Thursday as they boarded a train for Pullman and Saturday's football meeting with Washington State.

Six Top Squads Meet Sat.

NEW YORK (AP) — An intercollegiate football program that would do credit to the annual post season bowl competition on Jan. 1 will be presented tomorrow as six of the nation's top 10 teams meet head-on.

California, No. 4, clashes with Southern California, No. 7, in a game that may go a long way toward deciding the Pacific Coast Conference representative in the Rose Bowl.

Duke, No. 6, generally regarded as the king pin of the Southern Conference, tangles with Virginia, No. 9, best of the Southern independents. And UCLA, also very much in the running for the Rose Bowl, takes on 10th-ranking Wisconsin, the Big 10 title favorite, at Madison.

Wisconsin is the only one of the sextet that has lost a game. The Badgers have a 3-1 record. All of the others, except Virginia, are each undefeated in five games. The Cavaliers have won all four of their outings.

The remainder of the top 10, with the possible exception of top-ranked Michigan State, take on

what figures to be comparatively easy competition. The Spartans with a 4-0 slate play host to the Nittany Lions of Penn State, who have only a tie with Purdue to spoil an otherwise perfect five-game record.

Maryland, No. 2, plays host to a weak Louisiana State 2-3 eleven while Oklahoma, No. 3, tangles with Kansas State in a Big Seven Conference fray. Georgia Tech's Ramblin' Wrecks, No. 5, goes after its sixth straight, fourth in the Southeastern Conference, with Vanderbilt, 1-2-2 as the opponent.

And if the games among the top 10 are not enough to satisfy you,

there are such encounters as Pennsylvania - Navy, Purdue - Illinois, Holy Cross - Syracuse, Kansas - Michigan, North Carolina - Notre Dame, Princeton - Cornell, Stanford - Washington and Ohio State - Iowa.

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
