It's walnut picking time in Winston. The crop is reported to be heavy and cured almost without the aid of a drier due to the long warm fall.

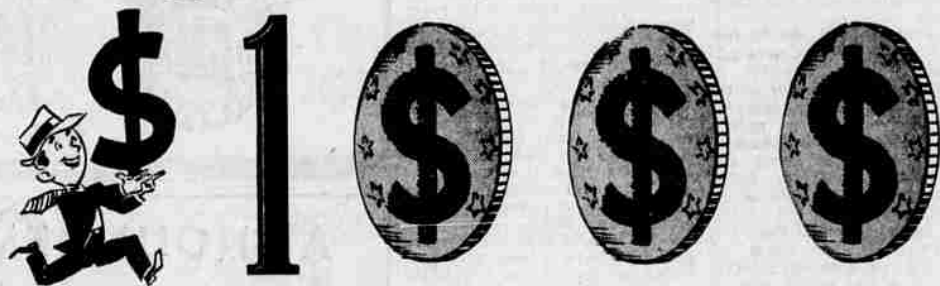


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**U.N. Must Stay
In Korea As Long
As Chinese, View**

SEOUL (AP) — Gen. James A. Van Fleet said United Nations troops would have to remain in Korea "as long as there are Chinamen here."

The Eighth Army commander, Fleet said Thursday night he asked for comment on a news report quoting him as saying South Korean troops would never be strong enough to hold the present battle line, said, "I didn't say that."

Van Fleet asserted he said only that the present Republic of Korea Army was not strong enough to hold the battle line.

William C. Foster, U. S. deputy secretary of defense, said the Republic of Korea had asked the United States for more financial assistance.

He praised the ROK units who have been shouldering the bulk of the fighting in recent weeks.

"They have been putting up a magnificent fight," Foster said it would take about 150 million dollars to equip a completely new South Korean division. "It costs just about as much per man as a U. S. division," he said.
