'Running Mate' Of MacArthur Hints Deadlock

SPOKANE—Gen. Douglas MacArthur's vice presidential "running mate" said Thursday his party will be on the ballot in 2 states and hopes to throw the presidential election into the House of Representatives.

State Sen. Jack B. Tenney, No. 2 man on the Christian Nationalist ticket, said he entered the campaign "to present the issues because there is no difference between Gen. Eisenhower and Gov. Stevenson."

MacArthur has never taken note of his nomination for president by the Christian Nationalists and Tenney declined to say if he has talked with the General about it. Tenney, who describes himself as a "Taft Republican," said the Republican convention at Chicago "stole the nomination from Taft and said they were going to shove Eisenhower down our throats. Some of us aren't swallowing. We want to revitalize and save the Republican party."

MacArthur and Tenney will appear on the ballot in Washington despite Republican attempts to get their names removed. GOP leaders appealed directly to MacArthur but received no reply.

Tenney told reporters he thinks his party could send the election to the House "if we can carry one state — like Washington or California. And we might. We're making a dent, no doubt about it."

The House of Representatives would select the president if neither Eisenhower nor Stevenson get enough electoral votes to win.

Tenney said he was elected to the state senate from Los Angeles county in 1950 by the largest majority ever given a state senator anywhere in the country.

American Press Favoring Ike, Authors Claim

NEW YORK — Ninety-four American authors, including 24 Pulitzer prize winners, say a majority of the nation's newspapers and magazines are showing "partisanship" in news on the presidential campaign.

In a statement, the authors said: "Ever since the beginning of the campaign we have seen an unrelenting attempt by the majority of our country's newspapers and magazines to play down one of the candidates. There have been notable exceptions, but they are few. 'Partisanship' has been allowed to soak through from its legitimate place on the editorial pages and in signed columns. It has been allowed to infect the very writing of the news and even more, the way it is displayed."

The authors, including novelists, historians, poets and dramatists, urged the public to listen to both major presidential candidates on television and radio to get "the one impression you can trust."

The statement did not specify the candidate the signers believed was being slighted.
