Jackson County Fugitive Facing Quiz In Murders

MEDFORD, Ore. (AP)—Police at Fresno, Calif., were reported Friday to be holding Jack P. Raullett, wanted here for giving a man what the Jackson county grand jury called "an unmerciful beating."

Raullett, alias J. P. Roulettel was indicted July 18 for assault and robbery while armed.

Sidney M. Browder, a veteran making his home at the Camp White domiciliary, was set on by two men last April and beaten and robbed.

Vernon C. Smith of Sacramento pleaded guilty and drew a three-year prison term. Raullett had been sought since.

Actress Loses 7-Year Battle After Gunshot

VISALIA, Calif. (AP)—Actress Susan Peters, whose fight against paralysis brought a living story of courage to Hollywood, lost her battle last night.

The attractive 31-year-old star, whose spinal cord was damaged in a hunting accident seven years ago, died while visiting her brother here.

In 1944 Susan was hailed as one of film's most promising actresses, and her future looked bright. Then on New Year's Day, 1945, she went duck hunting with her husband. As she reached for her rifle, it accidentally discharged, sending a bullet through her stomach to lodge in her spine.

After months of hospitalization, Susan went home—paralyzed from

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U.S. Overtaken In Atom Race, Britain Claims

LONDON (AP)—London newspapers speculated Friday that Britain has overtaken the United States in the race to produce a "perfect" atom weapon.

Scientific writers crowded over the assumption that Britain has found the secret of compressing the power of an ordinary sized A-bomb—generally regarded as unwieldy—into a charge small enough to be

fired from an 11-inch gun or carried easily aboard a plane.

To back their speculation was Air Ministry confirmation of a statement, made in Australia Thursday by a high Royal Air Force officer that all future British bombers would be made so they could carry the bomb.

Prime Minister Churchill, giving an elated account Thursday of the first British atomic explosion off Australia earlier this month, was careful not to reveal any details of the weapon.

The London Daily Mail Friday described the British weapon as the "smallest and most lethal weapon ever produced" and said

that, although it probably was much smaller than any tested by the Americans, it was as destructive as either of the two exploded over Japan during the war.

"Indications are," said the Daily Mail, "that the British weapon is so small it can be used as a bomb, guided missile, shell or even an underwater weapon."

The London Daily Herald said that British A-bombs went on the production lines as soon as satisfactory reports were received from the Monte Bello test.

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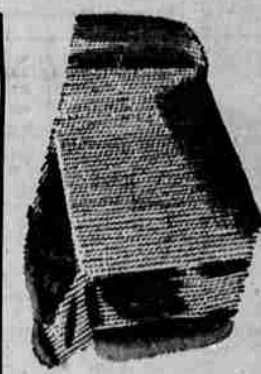
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
