PORTLAND, Ore. — An Astoria apartment house owner filed suit in Federal court here Thursday asking \$25,000 damages because of fine dust from a plywood plant.

The owner, Mrs. Anna Lahteenkorva, said that the finely powdered dust and wood "permeated" with glue and sticky material.

She said it was depriving her of a livelihood.

The defendant is the Astoria Plywood Corporation, whose mill was built a year ago.

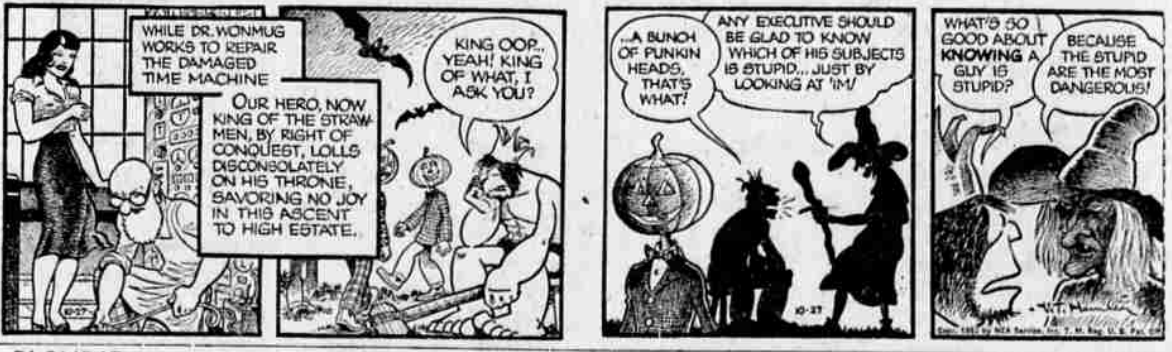

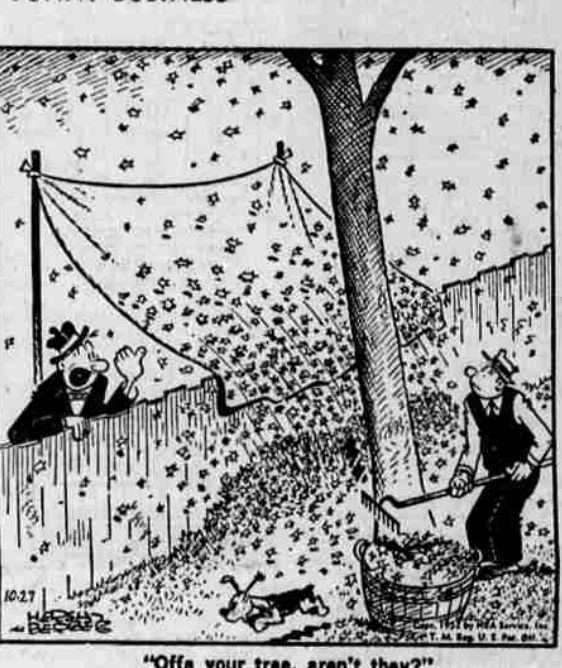
