**Defense Learns Bloody Clothes Are Destroyed**

**ALBANY, Ore. (AP)**—Defense attorneys learned to their surprise Friday that blood-stained clothes of Mrs. Margrethe Hansen, accused of first-degree murder, had been destroyed by the state.  
The disclosure was made in the questioning of Sgt. Wayne Huffman of the state police. Defense attorneys expressed surprise that the clothes had been destroyed even before the first trial of Mrs. Hansen.  
She was convicted in that trial at Corvallis of crushing her husband, Sigurd, to death with his car. The State Supreme Court threw out the conviction, and ordered this trial.  
Special Prosecutor John Galey said the destruction of the clothes, which the woman wore the night Hansen died, was accidental. He added that he would tell the court all the circumstances as soon as he learns all details.  
Defense Attorney Bruce Spaulding commented, "It may be accidental and it may not. At least they picked out her stuff to destroy, and nothing else."  
William Tugman Jr., Walla Walla, son-in-law of Mrs. Hansen,

testified on happenings at the Hansen apartment in Corvallis early in the night Hansen died.
