Program To Spur Interest Of Voters Through Schools Begun By Supt. Barneburg

An extensive program to stimulate voter interest through the schools is under way in Douglas County, School Supt. Kenneth F. Barneburg reported today.

In a letter to all school superintendents, principals and teachers in the county, the superintendent's office has requested that the schools participate in the project.

Through the project, Barneburg hopes to determine the total potential registered voters for each school district, and, after the Nov. 4 election, the percentage of the total that voted.

The superintendent also recommended that a straw ballot be taken in all upper school grades. "Democracy is in danger because an overly large segment of our population does not bother to vote," Barneburg said in his letter to school personnel. He added:

"One of our chief goals of our schools is to teach the individual how to live in a democratic society and his obligations therein, and since so many registered voters do not go to the polls, we are requesting each school to put into effect at once the plan in an effort to get out a large vote on Nov. 4."

Plan Is Explained

The plan will work like this: Each home room teacher is to discuss with her students the importance of voters' participation

in elections, and each child will be requested to determine the number of persons in his family who are over 21 and registered to vote.

The total will be added for each room and then the total for the school will be reported to the superintendent's office. An Oct. 31 deadline has been set for reporting totals.

Then, after the Nov. 4 election, each child is to determine the number of persons who actually voted, and the percentage of voters will be reported.

The program is expected to stimulate student interest in government affairs, and also stimulate voters to go to the polls Nov. 4, Barneburg said.

Roseburg Hears Baganz Trio Monday Night

The smooth, sustained, organ-like tones of vibraharp and marimba combined with a ringing harp obligato to bring "a little bit of heaven" to Roseburg music-lovers, Monday night, at the concert of sacred music by the Baganz Trio of Wisconsin in the Junior High School Auditorium.

Introduced by Rev. W. A. Sylwester, pastor of St. Paul's Lutheran Church of Roseburg, one of three Lutheran churches sponsoring their appearance, the trio members handled their instruments in a masterly manner.

Outstanding were the two harp solos by Otto Baganz, "Impromptu, theme and variations" by Edmund Schuecker, and "Christmas Memories" by Adam Hahn. Reuben Baganz played his own arrangement of "What A Friend We Have In Jesus" as a vibraharp solo. The tubular chimes, played by Rhoda Baganz, were featured in "Kammenoi Ostrow" (Vesper Bells) by Anton Rubinstein, also popular with the audience.

Stirring selections were "The Holy City" by Stephen Adams, perhaps better known to some as "Jerusalem, Awake!"; and "Finlandia," Jean Sibelius' passionate outcry for his native land, which has been borrowed from the melody of "Be Still, My Soul."

The enthusiastic audience called the trip back for an encore, "Lullaby" by Brahms.

Roseburg residents who missed the concert here on Monday night may be able to catch the appearance of this talented group in Medford on Tuesday night, or in Grants Pass Wednesday night. From there, they will travel to Crescent City in their two trailer-houses. MILK PRODUCTION AND MARKETING ACT BILL—Purpose: Authorizes governor to appoint milk control administrator, an instrumentality of state, with annual salary of \$7200, vested with power to investigate and regulate the production of milk for human consumption within the state. Act requires butterfat labeling of milk and licensing of milk dealers. Appropriates license fees for expense of administration. Authorizes administrator to designate marketing areas, require uniform records and accounts to be kept by producers and dealers, fix minimum milk production prices after public hearing, and require bonds of milk dealers. Appeals are provided for and penalties for violations; all existing milk control laws are repealed.

Funeral services will be held Thursday, Oct. 30, at the Catholic Church at Port Angeles.

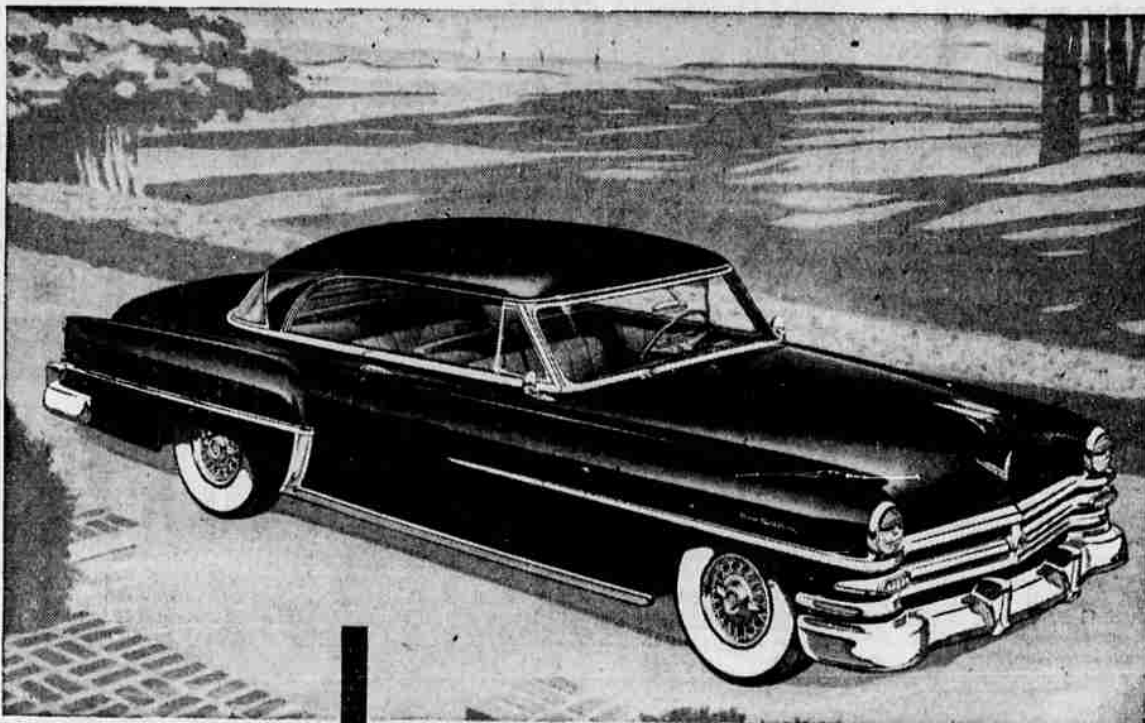
