VIENNA (AP) — In a small village in the Russian Zone of Austria, mid-afternoon wine drinkers in an inn looked sour when a high Soviet officer stopped his car and walked in to relax.

Disturbed by the unfriendliness, the Russian ordered wine for all. Word quickly spread. Most of the villagers appeared. The Russian ordered more drinks as a sign of "Austro-Russian friendship." The mayor and his wife were summoned.
After two hours' merriment, the Russian left. Several days later, the mayor received a bill for "entertainment of population" from the innkeeper.
"The Soviet officer left without paying," he explained. "I tried to collect from the Russian Kommandantura, but they sent it back."

Congress To See New Faces After Next Election

WASHINGTON (AP) — There are going to be a lot of new faces in the next Congress, regardless of the outcome of Tuesday's elections. Resignations, defeat in primaries, and the quest for other offices already have removed 57 incumbents, including some veteran lawmakers.
Besides, either Sen. John Sparkman (D-Ala.) or Sen. Richard Nixon (R-Calif.) will give up his Senate seat in January to become Vice President and president of the Senate.
Tuesday's voting, if it follows the pattern of past elections, will further thin out the ranks of senators and representatives serving in the present Congress.
Among the more prominent legislators who will be missing when the new Congress convenes in January are Sens. Kenneth McKellar (D-Tenn.), Tom Connally (D-Tex.) and Owen Brewster (R-Me.), and Reps. Robert Doughton (D-N.C.), John E. Rankin (D-Miss.), Charles Eaton (R-N.J.), and Roy Woodruff (R-Mich.).

In all, 28 members of the present Congress — three senators and 25 representatives — are retiring voluntarily. Eleven others — two senators and nine representatives — were defeated in primary elections. Eighteen — all representatives — gave up their house seats to bid for other offices.
Those retiring voluntarily include Republican Rep. Stockman of Oregon.
Among 18 who gave up House seats to seek other office are Reps. Hugh Mitchell and Henry Jackson of Washington. Mitchell is the Democratic nominee for governor, and Jackson the Democrats' choice for the Senate.

GMC Official Expects Few Changes In Autos
HOUSTON (AP) — Revolutionary changes in automobiles in the next 25 years are not likely in the opinion of Dr. Charles F. Kettering, vice president of the General Motors research division.
The 77-year-old executive said here recently that dieselization of passenger cars is not feasible. The automotive industry's present ambitions are concerned with making cars more efficient, more durable, better styled and better equipped from the standpoint of their power plants.
He said that new high-compression engines will give motorists from 25 to 40 per cent more gasoline mileage. He predicted that such engines will not become generally available for five or six years although a few may show up in the next year or so.
