Nobel Prizes Go To Top Savants, French Author

STOCKHOLM, Sweden (AP) — The roster of 1952 Nobel prizes was in physics, chemistry and literature.

The winners:

Physics—Dr. Felix Bloch, 47, of Stanford University, Calif., and Dr. Edward Mills Purcell, 40 Harvard University.

Chemistry—Dr. Archer Martin, 42, London, and Dr. Richard Synge, 38, Aberdeen, Scotland.

Literature—Francois Mauriac, 67, French Catholic author.

Medicine—Dr. Selman A. Waksman, 64, Russian-born American scientist from Rutgers University, New Brunswick, N. J. (awarded last month).

Peace—No peace prize was awarded this year.

The two American scientists — Dr. Bloch and Dr. Purcell—were recognized for their development of a new method to measure magnetic fields in atomic nuclei.

Dr. Martin and Dr. Synge won the chemistry prize for discovery of partition chromatography — an ingenious method of separating compounds.

Dr. Waksman won the prize in medicine for his work in the discovery of streptomycin and its effect against tuberculosis.

Each prize carries a cash award of 171,134 Swedish crowns (\$33,037).

In cases of joint awards the money is divided. The money comes from the nine million dollar fund set up in the will of Alfred Nobel, the Swedish inventor of dynamite, for recognition of those who contribute most to the advancement of mankind.

He died in 1896, and the first award was made in 1901.

Beer, Hot Dogs Favorite Diet Of Show Horse

 NEW YORK (AP) — You've no doubt heard of talking horses, dancing horses, midget horses and just about everything except flying horses.

But did you ever hear of a horse that trains on beer?

Well, there is such an animal and it's no ploy, either.

The horse's name is Montgomery's Payoff and it's in the five-gaited division of the National Horse Show which Thursday entered the third session of an eight-day run in Madison Square Garden.

Before you give out with a "horse" laugh, permit us to report that we saw the horse drink a bottle of beer before our own popping eyes.

"And furthermore," said trainer William Dearing, top hand of the Gold Crest Farm of Dunnellen, N. J., "Payoff eats anything a human being will eat—hot dogs, pizza pies, hamburgers, anything you can name."

We can't attest to the horse's dietary habits, but to watch it drink the beer borders on the unbelievable. Dearing tells Payoff to raise his head and up it goes. He then holds the bottle on the side of Payoff's mouth and down go the suds.

"I've been in this business 20 years," said Dearing, "and I've never seen a show horse drink beer the way Payoff does. When he is being exercised after competing, instead of water we give him beer."

"I tried it one day a long time ago when Payoff began nibbling at a bottle. I was drinking and he liked it so much he's been doing it since."
