 TAIPEH (AP)—A howling tropical typhoon battered Southwest Formosa Thursday night, leaving a wake of destruction and death in the important port city of Keelung and the nearby Nationalist China Tsoying naval base.
 The known toll at those two points exceeded 65 dead and 600 injured.
 There were only fragmentary reports from other points isolated by ripped telephone and telegraph lines.
