NANAIMO, B. C. (U.S.) — Trapped in their rooms, six persons perished Friday in an early morning fire on the Indian reserve here.

A son, Clifford Thomas, saved two other children, tossing them out a flame-encircled window then dropped to safety himself.

The victims were 37-year-old fisherman Max Thomas, his wife, his brother, James, 32, and three of his six children, Elsie, 4, Max Jr., 2, and Patricia, six months.

Vote In Douglas Over 80 Percent

Douglas County's official vote was a fraction over 80 percent of the eligible registered voters, final tabulations from the ballot canvass by the county clerk's office, completed Thursday, reveal.

The total vote was 22,646, and a revised registered voters' list showed 28,233 eligible to cast ballots for the general election.

The official tabulation did not alter the outcome in any position and reported by the News-Review after the election. In most instances the unofficial tabulation varied only a few votes, and six of the counts on candidates and measures were exactly the same.

The final tally in the Clarence Leonard recall vote showed 844 in favor and 913 against recall. The previous vote total was not available. The final count on the county library "expression" vote showed 10,638 in favor of a county library and 4,268 opposed.

A complete tabulation of the official return will appear in Saturday's News-Review.
