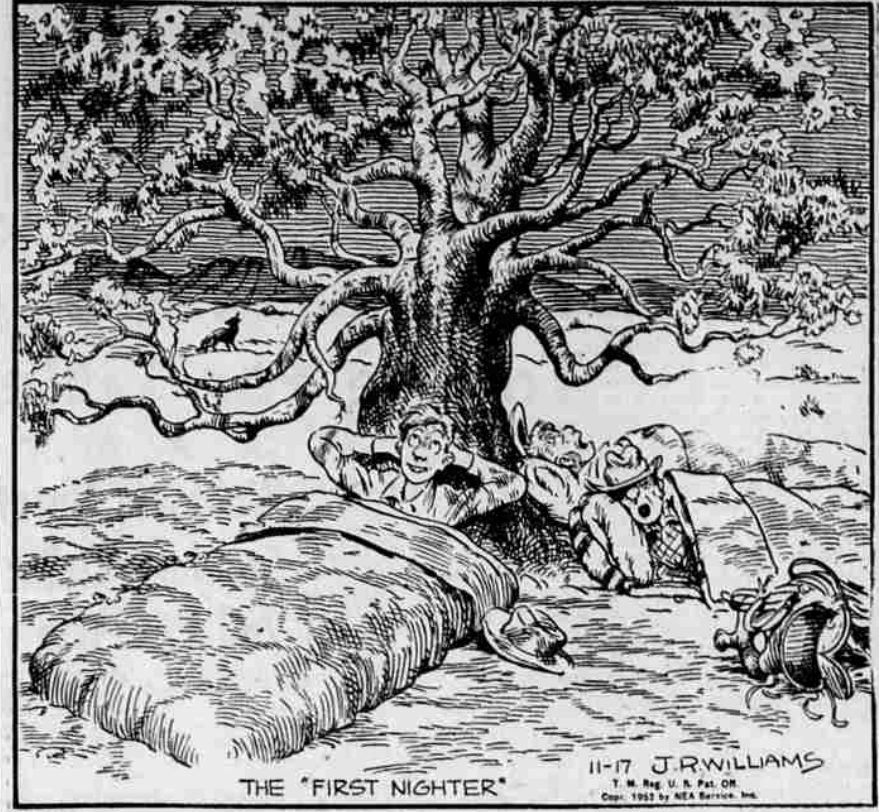

SEARCHERS RECOVER BODIES IN PLANE CRASH
SHELTON, Wash. (AP) — Searchers have recovered bodies of all 11 men killed in the crash of a Navy four-engine bomber into an Olympic Peninsula hillside near here Wednesday.

The Navy announced plans to use power saws to clear a landing spot so helicopters could bring out the bodies, which will be taken to the Naval Hospital at Bremerton.

A three-member Navy board of investigation reached the crash scene late Friday.

The Navy Privateer plane took off from Sand Point Naval Air Station at 6:11 p.m. Wednesday on a training flight. It crashed a half-hour later.

U.S. Entering Period Of Lower Military Budgets

PROVIDENCE, R. I. (AP) — Defense Secretary Robert Lovett said Saturday "we are now entering a period of lower military budgets."

Lovett said the major capital investments and the heaviest portion of purchases have been largely authorized and funded. Then he added:

"If this orderly decrease is continued for a short period we should reach a level which can be sustained... without doing too much damage to our national economy or our social system."

Lovett expressed his views in an address delivered at a ceremony at Brown University, dedicating a "Patriots Court."

In the ceremony, Patriots Court, one of two courtyards in Brown's new eight and one-half million dollar housing quadrangle, was dedicated "to the men of Brown who have died in the service of their country since 1775."

The defense secretary did not mention specific figures in his prepared talks. However, there have been unofficial predictions that the military budget for the next fiscal year might be between \$9 billion and \$11 billion dollars. This would compare with a high since the start of the Korean war of about \$16 billion dollars.

Lovett apparently was referring to military budget requests to congress for annual appropriations, not to total military expenditures.

He cautioned that what is needed is a stabilized military program instead of peaks and valleys of effort.
