The meeting was adjourned and the Grangers enjoyed potato salad, cake and coffee.

Fake Dops Prescriptions Put Medic On Probation

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Actress Joan Leslie's husband, Dr. William C. Caldwell, has been placed on three years' probation and fined \$300 after pleading guilty to using fraudulent narcotic prescriptions.

Dr. Caldwell, 37-year-old World War II Navy surgeon, told the court yesterday he became addicted to narcotics while using them after an attack of pneumonia last February. He said he shook the habit during a vacation trip to Wyoming last summer with his wife.

The physician was accused of writing seven prescriptions in the names of patients and having them filled for his own use.

6-Day Grocery Store Week Will Be Sought

PORTLAND (AP) — The Oregon Food Merchants Association wants grocery stores required by law to close one day a week.

Ward McNulty, secretary, said the organization will ask the Legislature to pass a law prohibiting grocery stores from remaining open more than six days a week. The proposed legislation would require stores to close Sunday—or one other day—and on all legal

holidays, McNulty said. The Legislature also will be asked to provide penalties for violation of the present state price law. It requires grocers to sell items at not less than cost plus 6 per cent.

McNulty said the association will continue efforts to obtain a lower price for milk sold in stores than for home-delivered milk.

Monopoly Trial Opens For Du Pont Empire

CHICAGO (AP) — The six-billion dollar du Pont chemical and industrial empire goes on trial in Federal Court today on government charges that the huge firm is monopolistic.

The suit was first brought in 1949 charging that E. I. du Pont de Nemours Company of Wilmington, Del., General Motors Corp., and the U. S. Rubber Company violated the Sherman Antitrust Act.

The government contended the firms violated the act by restraining trade through secret rebates and by dividing several fields of manufacturing amongst themselves to eliminate competition.

The charges have been denied.

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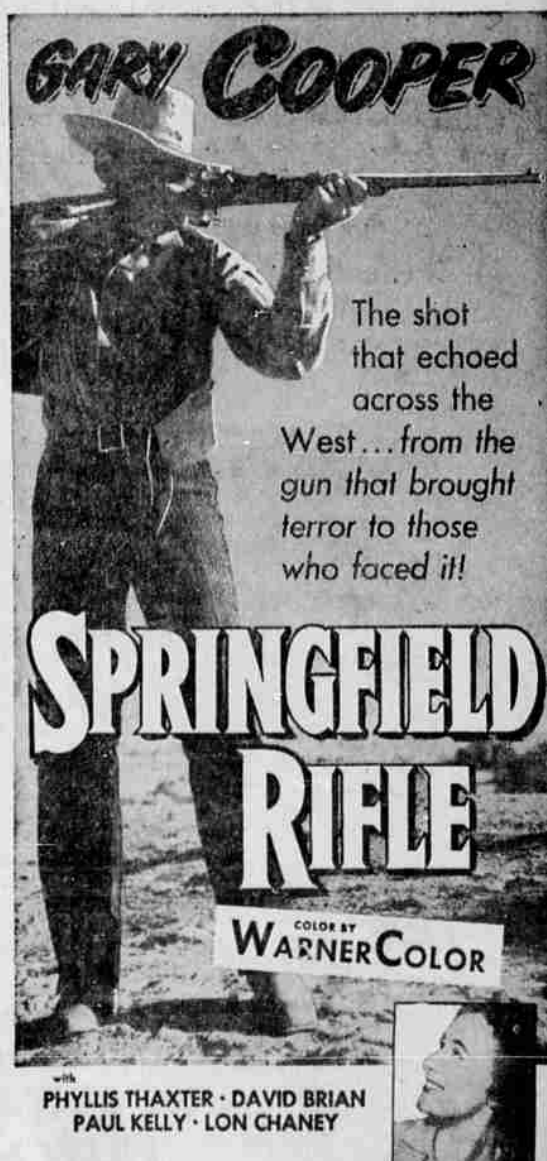


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
