Heinrich Loses No. 1 Offense Spot In U. S.

NEW YORK (AP)—The wild scramble in which Tulsa's football team outran Detroit by a 52-21 score last Friday night not only drove the statisticians crazy but also made two of the game's stars tops in individual offense maneuvers among the nation's college teams.

Ted Marchbroda, Detroit's busy quarterback, gained a record 390 yards from passing to vault from fourth to first in total offense with a total of 1,666 yards.

He connected on 27 of 54 passes and also gained seven yards to displace Don Heinrich of Washington as No. 1 in the country, figures announced by the National Collegiate A. A. Statistical Bureau disclosed.

Heinrich, who completed only two passes for 14 yards in Washington's 33-0 pasting from Southern California, managed to retain his hold on the No. 1 spot in passing offense with 130 completions.

LOS ANGELES (AP)—Washington's Don Heinrich was stopped cold by Southern California last week but he still leads the Coast Conference in total offense, with 1506 yards.

All but four of those yards were gained passing, statistics issued Wednesday by the conference disclosed.

California's Johnny Olzewski has had his troubles, too, but he continues to lead the loop in rushing yardage with a net 723.

Scoring honors are divided between George Black, Washington; Olzewski, Don Johnson, and Bill Powell, California, each with seven touchdowns and 42 points.

Bill Stits, UCLA, took over the pass interception lead, with seven for return of 196 yards and one touchdown.

Jim Sears, USC, is far ahead in punt returns—25 for 431 yards and three touchdowns.

2 Women Last U.S. Hope For Aussie Tennis Glory

SYDNEY, Australia (AP)—Maureen Connolly, America's queen of the courts and Julie Sampson are the United States' lone hopes of salvaging some glory in the New South Wales tennis tournament.

Miss Connolly and Miss Sampson gained the semi-final round in the women's play Wednesday. "Little Mo" turned back Laurie Nichols, 6-1, 6-1, and Miss Sampson defeated Gwendyth Bryant, 6-2, 6-4.

Meanwhile, powerful Australians eliminated America's Davis Cuppers, Capt. Vic Seixas and Straight Clark, from the singles and doubles.

Sooners Threaten To Leave Big Seven For Bowl Tilt

NORMAN, Okla. (AP)—Oklahoma astonished the Big Seven Conference last night by threatening to withdraw and accept a football bowl bid—perhaps to the Orange Bowl—in defiance of conference rules.

The surprise announcement came from Dr. George L. Cross, university president, who told a student rally he would sanction a bowl trip if the team wants to go.

He and Athletic Director Bud Wilkinson met this morning to discuss the explosive subject—and perhaps decide whether to sever their ancient ties with the Big Seven.

Dr. Cross indicated strongly the Sooners, fifth ranked in the nation and headed for a fifth straight loop crown, have their eye on the Orange Bowl, from which he reported receiving several inquiries.

Such a course, he told cheering students, would entail withdrawing from the conference—and turning independent—or certain suspension for violating the bowl ban adopted last December. And he added:

"The only honorable course would be to withdraw from the conference."

As for himself, he said, "I would be perfectly willing to go," but he pointed out he couldn't authorize a trip unless all concerned agreed to face conference disciplinary action, or other consequences.

"Neither Bud or I think it would be smart to violate the rules," he declared.

The development came only a week after faculty representatives meeting in Kansas City, refused to make an exception to the conference restriction on any postseason athletic activity.

Smouldering Discontent

It also brought to the surface long-smouldering discontent, referred to by Dr. Cross cryptically last night when he said, "We're in the doghouse with the Big Seven for many reasons."

Asked about the conference position at a Quarterbacks Club meeting Monday, Wilkinson said:

"I have a strong feeling the rule will be changed in January, but that's just a month too late."

Varsity Hoop Squad Cut

Coach Dick Ballantyne sliced his varsity basketball squad almost to the bone this week.

A force of 14 hopefuls remain in contention for the 12 places on the varsity squad. The final two will be lopped off in the next week, according to Ballantyne.

Five lettermen are listed with the present turnout. They are Bud Backen, Brian Booth, Irv Darling, Jim Gilbert and the only letterman guard, Jerry Parmeter. The squad will definitely be of the underclassman variety. Only three seniors are listed. They are Backen, Ronnie Groves and Steve Danchock. Four sophomores stud the

squad and seven are juniors. Crabb, a junior from Cottage Grove.

Sophomores George Donnelly, Paul Hatcher and Howard Backen are up from last year's freshman squad, and Nub Beamer is a transfer from Sutherlin High School. The only other transfer is Gary Donnelly. Most
