Jack Church has been seriously ill at his home with the flu.

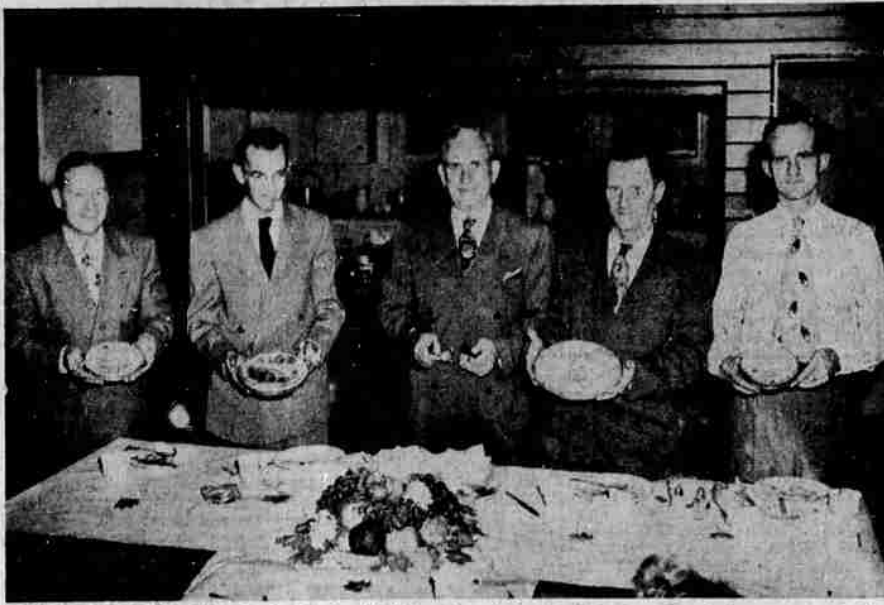
