**Gladys Ward, Missionary To Be Speaker Here**

Born in China of missionary parents, Miss Gladys Ward, herself a missionary for many years, will speak this Sunday morning, Nov. 23, at the North Roseburg Church, Evangelical United Brethren, on conditions behind the Bamboo Curtain. The service is at 11 o'clock.

After 28 years in that land of "strange customs and ancestor worship," Miss Ward has been described as "truly more Chinese than American." For a number of years she served as principal of the Evangelical United Brethren Girls' Seminary at Siu Laam. AQS A PART of her work, she frequently conducted groups of native Chinese on tours of evangelism in remote villages.

Following the entry of the Chinese Communist forces into the Korean War, there was a marked change in policy toward Christian missionaries, according to Miss Ward. These meetings were followed by expulsion or detention of individuals as seemed best to the local authorities. The result was a rapid and mass evacuation. These and other experiences will be described by Miss Ward when she speaks here.

This Sunday's services will be the last public appearance for Miss Ward before she leaves for further missionary work in the Philippines. The public is invited to hear her speak.
