

Glide Plans Boxing Card For Tuesday

Glide turns to boxing for a night Tuesday at 7 with a benefit card checked with no less than 21 amateur matches at the High School gym.

The proceeds from the smoker will be used to purchase high school and grade school athletic equipment. The card is made up largely of grade school and high school talent, but the twin main events stack up as better than average matches.

In one mainer, a Glide High School grad, Carl Jenkins, runs up against Tom Amos, a former Golden Gloves winner from New York. The two weigh in at 155. The other top match sends an unannounced Roseburg YMCA boxer against Glide's Jim Mullin. Mullin, at 118, is a Southern Oregon College student who currently holds the bantamweight crown in the Far West Intercollegiate Conference.

Promoter Bernie Hill, Glide's High School coach, pegs a battle between Dickie Smith and Wayne Kennedy as the match to watch in the grade school ranks, and the high school match between Charles Ferguson and Charles Marier.

Admission prices to see the bulky amateur card are one dollar for adults and 25 cents for high school and grade school students.

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Sutherlin Hosts Hoopsters Tues.

Four "A" school basketball teams turn Sutherlin into the heart of the County Tuesday night at 7.

The Sutherlin High School gym won't be the scene of any significant battle from the league standpoint. But the four-team round-robin in Jamboree should give a fair indication of the team or teams to watch in the forthcoming Sub-district 5 casaba campaigns.

Listed for play in the six quarters of action are Roseburg, Reedsport, Myrtle Creek and, of course, the Sutherlin hosts. It is apparently the first time all four teams of the Sub-district have taken part in the kickoff Jamboree.

The defending champions are the Roseburg Indians, but they will be hard pressed to hold their Jamboree toga with the Reedsport Braves taking part in the activities. The Braves were not included in the Jamboree last year. However, they went on to capture the sub-district crown last year, and three of their five starters are back this year. The other two squads, Sutherlin and Myrtle Creek are largely unknown quantities.

This is the year the teams look as the season opener approaches. ROSEBURG — The Indians, who lost to the Reedsport Braves in the Sub-district race last year, come back to the hoop wars with five lettermen, but only one starter from 1951-52 team. Coach Dick Ballantyne takes the reins for the second year and has little to say of expectations for this campaign.

He points out that rugged Jim Gilbert at 6-2 is the only returnee from last year's starting squad. He expects to see the squad reach its peak midway in the 1952-53 campaign.

He will depend heavily on reserves from last year's squad, such as Brian Booth, Irv Darling, Jerry Parmeter and Bud Backen. In the height department, the Indians have four even six footers; Gilbert is 6-2 and Backen is the tallest man on the squad at 6-2 1/2.

One of Sutherlin's top junior vars will be playing against his former Bulldog teammates in Indian uniform. He is Guard Nub Beamer, who transferred to Roseburg this year.

MYRTLE CREEK — Last year's Josephine-Douglas-Jackson League champions find their hoop prospects at a new low this year, according to reports from veteran Coach Bob Abrahamson. A total of 39 boys turned out for basketball this year and, of these, 30 four were graduated and four were freshmen and sophomores.

Of last year's 12 varsity members, four have transferred away, are back. From the four returnees, Jerry Jones is absent until at least after Christmas. The six-foot one-inch center broke a leg in the fall football wars. He is the only returning regular from last year.

Coupled with the lack of experience facing Coach Abrahamson is an even more obvious lack of height. With Jones out for the early part of the season, the only six-footers are found in the freshman class. Their inexperience should just about eliminate them from the varsity until next year.

They are Paul Redlingshafer at 6-1 and David Creason at 6-4. Not a single six-footer is to be found. Abrahamson is depending on three lettermen, a youngster up from the Jayvees and two transfers. The lettermen are John Cavaner, Dick Komp and Wilson Barnes. Both Cavaner and Barnes saw considerable action last year, and Komp was letterman from his sophomore year. He was out

a large part of the 1951-52 season because of a broken arm. Roland Dyer is up from the Jayvees and will team with Cavaner. Dick Musick and Glen Davidson, both 5-11, are the top prospects. Musick was a star end on the football squad. He comes from from Riddle.

SUTHERLIN — The hosting Bulldogs have six lettermen back. Coach Dick Yurk takes over the high school squad for the first time this year after coaching in the Sutherlin grade school system. He is the third coach in three years to move into the Bulldog basketball coaching position.

The six lettermen who turned out with the 30 young hopefuls were: Mervin Koozer, Ted Buck,

One six-footer who will stand out for the Bulldogs is Bob Galla, who is 6-4.

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Bob Wheeler and Jerry Plug are the other two lettermen. Both saw considerable action last year. Any gaps Coach Norm Olson might find will be filled by members of last year's "B" team and a prime transfer prospect from McKenzie High School, Wally Long.
