

Handcar Topples Off Trestle; Two Killed

NEW WESTMINSTER, B.C. (AP) — A small handcar toppled off a trestle Friday night and plunged to the bottom of a 100-foot deep ravine, killing two young railway workers and injuring a third. Heinz Schulze, 22, and Beverly Campbell, 20, were crushed to death beneath the handcar and 4-ton timbers the three-man crew was using in repair work on the Canadian National Railway trestle. Thomas Bowling, 25, survived the fall.

Mrs. Kinto Desmare Merrill of Palm each and New York City yesterday filed an answer to a divorce suit filed last June 23 by Charles Edward Merrill, member of the brokerage firm of Merrill, Lynch, Pierce, Fenner & Beane. Merrill, 66, alleged his wife was guilty of extreme cruelty and had a violent and ungovernable temper.

Defense Department Information Source

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Defense Department's public information office will be the sole military releasing agency for information on atomic energy, guided missiles and new weapons, under a directive by Defense Secretary Lovett.

A spokesman said the directive, issued yesterday, puts in writing practices previously followed but not set out in detail. The order provides that a writer must get approval from the information office before visiting military bases to get his data. Only unclassified information will be given him, and the material to be published must be submitted to the department's security review branch before publication.

Edgar Bergen Readies Second 'Santa' Flight

Edgar Bergen, Charlie McCarthy and other members of CBS' "McCarthy Show" will start their second airborne "Operation Santa Claus" Friday, Dec. 12, when they take off in a U. S. Air Force C-47 cargo plane to distribute Christmas gifts to wounded servicemen in military hospitals across the nation.

Since his regular CBS Radio Broadcast of Sunday, Nov. 16, Edgar Bergen has been appealing weekly to listeners to send gifts, but no cash to: Edgar Bergen, Operation Santa Claus, c/o CBS Radio, Hollywood, California.

Last year some 32,000 individual items were mailed in response to Bergen's requests, and he and his troupe delivered some 72,000 pounds of gift packages to hospitalized Army, Navy and Air Force personnel. A C-47 cargo plane shuttled across the country six times to replenish the original gift cargo with which Bergen took off from California.

Though Bergen's radio appeals pointedly did not ask for cash contributions, about \$4,000 in cash was received. Most of it was in small sums, he people of one small community, Post, Texas, sent enough gifts to provide for a whole hospital. A supermarket owner in Hartford, Conn., sent a contribution so generous that the expressage alone on the package amounted to \$40.

West's Proposed Peace Contract Gains Support

BONN, Germany (AP) — The West's proposed peace contract and military alliance with West Germany won substantial votes of approval Saturday on their second reading before the lower house of Parliament.

Third and final readings are expected next month. Saturday's preliminary vote in the Bundestag was 218 to 164 on the peace contract, which would restore virtual German sovereignty. The vote was 218 to 165 on the pact to weld West Germany to the proposed six-nation European Defense Community (EDC) and raise a German army of a half million men.

The Bundestag acted in the early hours after a raging, 35-hour debate led for the government by 77-year-old Chancellor Konrad Adenauer.

In heated arguments Friday night with Socialist opponents the chancellor said the United States had promised billions of dollars to equip West German troops with the "best and most modern weapons." Listeners understood him to use a figure of 40 billion marks (\$9,520,000,000).

However, the U. S. high commission in Germany later said it had been assured by Adenauer that "whatever he said in the heat of the moment, he did not mean the United States has promised arms in the amount of 40 billion marks." The figure is the estimated total outlay for raising and equipping the proposed 12 West German divisions. A large part of the amount is expected to be raised by the Germans themselves.

AIR RAID ALARMS

NEW YORK (AP) — A surprise air raid drill in four Rockefeller Center Buildings yesterday sent more than 40,000 persons scurrying to shelter areas in less than three minutes.

Among those affected by the alert, one of the city's first surprise tests, were employees of 11,000 firms along with 10,000 visitors in the busy midtown center.
