World Wars I and II. He said: "It's a force that isn't the wisecracking force of World War II. It isn't the singing force of World War I. But they are young men that know they're out there doing a serious job, and they're doing it without whining and without complaining."

He made special mention of the ROK Republic of Korea divisions: "For the competence and courage of the Republic of Korea's own fighting forces, so finely trained by Gen. James A. Van Fleet, I heard only the highest praise from all U.N. commanders. My own inspection of some Korean units completely confirmed this estimate. ROK's they are called and rocks they are."

He said he had seen some other United Nations units as well, and said: "Their combat records are worthy of their countries' proud traditions."

Major Tasks Told

With respect to the future, he made three points:

"First, the training of ROK forces can and should be expanded and speeded. This is my opinion and the unanimous opinion of the commanders on the scene."

"Second, . . . certain problems of supply have reached rather serious proportions, and require early correction."

"Finally, we must all recognize—in all our thinking and our planning—that the Korean War is but the most dramatic and most painful phase, for us at this moment, of our world-wide struggle

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82 Slain, 120 Wounded In Korean Camp Mutiny

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All are Koreans, probably a mixture of both North and South Koreans who cling grimly to their Communist leadership.

In the matter of repatriation, all have elected to return to Communist control.

The Pongnam riot is certain to provoke a strong blast from North Korean Gen. Nam Il, senior Red delegate to the suspended Korean truce talks.

In the past, Nam unfailingly has lodged protests within a day or two after each such incident.

SEUL, (AP)—Chinese Reds struck through rain and snow today at three heights on the Central Korean Front, warring one outpost from hard-fighting South Koreans. The Chinese hit Pinpoint Hill, Rocky Point and outpost positions on the lower slopes of Triangle Hill. They overran two South Korean outposts in pitched battles, but counterattacking Republic of Korea troops recaptured the larger one.

Allied warplanes damaged two MIG-15 jets in a flurry of 10 air battles over Northwest Korea.

Fifteen U. S. Superforts Sunday night blasted a supply center and an ore-processing plant in North-west Korea. The Kyompo steel mill storage area southwest of Pyongyang and a Red Korean military headquarters near the capital city also were bombed.

Gale-Lashed U.S. Ship Splits In Two On Rocks

LEGHORN, Italy (AP)—The 3,800-ton U. S. Navy refrigerated ship Grommet Reefer broke in half on the rocks of Leghorn harbor Monday with 40 men aboard. She was driven aground by gale whipped seas.

The first member of the crew was brought to safety in a breeches buoy nearly 12 hours later.

He was Carl Treudler of Belvedere, N. Y., the ship's first engineer. Treudler said the other 39 crew members were uninjured.

The men were aboard the stern section of the ship, firmly lodged on rocks about 100 yards off shore. The bow half of the vessel drifted about the harbor for several hours and then crashed on rocks nearby.

The ship's cargo includes seven tons of turkeys for soldier dinners in Austria and Italy.

Prisoner Will Resist Habitual Criminal Count

ALBANY, Ore. (AP)—William Sanford Green, 29, will direct his own defense in Circuit Court here next week as he resists the state's effort to classify him as an habitual criminal.

He will be accompanied from the state prison at Salem, where he now is doing 30 years for rape, by two fellow convicts. They are Elmer Davis, 40, and Theodore Macomber, 48. Macomber is himself doing life as an habitual criminal and his son also is a prison inmate—the son Gerald having been involved in a spectacular hunt last fall after an escape.

Davis and Macomber will be used by Green as character witnesses. Sheriff H. A. Southard said. Green's record shows a larceny from a ship in Coos County a dozen years ago; burglary not in a dwelling; rape of a 15-year-old girl and rape of a 63-year-old woman.

The current action, opening Tuesday, is to reclassify his status. The state seeks a life term rather than the 30-year term imposed on the last rape conviction.

Green notified the court he would defend himself. He expressed a feeling that he was double-crossed by attorneys in the past.

Streamliner Derailed, Four Passengers Hurt

SPOKANE, (AP)—The Milwaukee Railroad's crack Hiawatha-Olympian streamliner hit a broken rail at 30 miles an hour near here early Monday and seven cars jumped the track.

At least four passengers were injured and hospitalized. Four crewmen reported minor hurts.

Two passenger cars overturned as they left the rails.

The 12-car train, en route to Seattle from Chicago, had slowed down for a curve.

Superintendent Al Thor said the rail apparently broke after the engine passed over it.

Lie Detector Doesn't Link 2 In Murder Case

FRESNO, Calif. (AP)—Officers said Monday lie detector tests had failed to link Wendell Hall, 49, and his son, Travis, 27, with the \$7,128 blood-gone massacre of Gard Young and three small children.

They said both the father, held here, and the son, held in San Francisco, would be released unless further questioning developed tangible clues. Both Halls denied any link with the robbery killings. They were jailed on a technical holding charge.

Eisenhower, says the committee in charge of inauguration festivities, will be the 34th president of the U. S.

Grover Cleveland served two terms separated by four years, so Eisenhower will be the 33rd man to be president. Government reference books list President Truman as the 33rd president, but the official program for his inauguration in 1949 called him the 32nd.

Chairman Joseph C. McGarraghy of the Eisenhower-Nixon Inaugural Committee said Sunday the Jan. 20 program will list Eisenhower as the 34th president, "thus correcting the erroneous count."

Israeli Bombing Effort Draws Term In Prison

TEL AVIV, Israel (AP)—A 29-year-old man who tried to plant a time bomb in the Israeli Foreign Office last October was sentenced Saturday to 21 months in prison.

Dov Shitvansky, a former member of the nationalist underground, was arrested when he carried the ticking bomb into the busy government office. He said he intended it as a warning against acceptance of German reparations for crimes against the Jews in Nazi Germany.

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Mrs. P. Rummell, Former Roseburg Teacher, Passes

Mrs. Phillip Rummell, formerly Phoebe Hawthorne, died Friday night in Eureka, Calif., according to word received here by relatives.

Mrs. Rummell was stricken with polio in September and was completely paralyzed from the neck down. She gave birth to a daughter, Phoebe Jane, in November. Her husband was also stricken with polio this fall and is partially paralyzed. The Rummells also have a two-year-old son, Harry.

Prior to her marriage, Mrs. Rummell was employed as a teacher in the Roseburg High School. Dr. Rummell's brother and sister-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. Paul Rummell of Dillard, are in Eureka to assist the family.

Mrs. Rummell was the daughter of Rev. and Mrs. Alexander Hawthorne of Monroe, Ore. A native of Paisley, Ore., she was a member of the Presbyterian Church of Eureka; the American Association of University Women and the Humboldt County Medical Auxiliary. She was graduated from Linfield College, McMinnville, and the University of Oregon. She taught in several Oregon schools. Since her marriage to Dr. Rummell, they resided in San Francisco and San Leandro, Calif., prior to moving to Eureka in 1951.

Funeral services were held this afternoon from the First Presbyterian Church in Eureka with Rev. L. F. Eisel officiating.
