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Navy To Lay Keel For Supersized Aircraft Carrier

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Navy will lay the keel of its second supersize carrier at the Brooklyn Navy Yard next Tuesday.

Secretary of the Navy Dan Kimball will preside over the traditional ceremony when a keel plate is lowered into place for the 60,000-ton carrier Saratoga.

She will be a sister ship of the Carrier Forrestal, on which construction started at the Newport News Shipbuilding and Drydock Company, in Virginia, last July.

The new class ships (Kimball has said he hopes the Navy would build them at a rate of one a year for ten years) will be flush-deck flattops, capable of carrying more than 100 planes of the modern, heavy jet type.

Flight deck of the Forrestal class is 1,040 feet; the width 252 feet. Speed of the ships will be "in excess of 30 knots," says the Navy.

The estimated cost of the Saratoga is \$209,700,000, about eight million dollars less than the Forrestal.

The new carrier is the sixth Navy ship to bear the name of the famous revolutionary war battle. The last Saratoga, also a carrier, was sunk in the atom bomb tests at Bikini Lagoon in 1946.

Special Report On Wilson Bros. Case Submitted

OLYMPIA (AP) — A special report on the Wilson brothers case has been received by Governor Langlie's office, the governor's assistant, Fred Koch, disclosed Friday.

Governor Langlie was in Phoenix, Ariz., attending the western governor's conference and was not expected to return until the middle of next week.

Langlie said two weeks ago that he would not make a decision on the fate of the brothers until three or four days before the execution, which is scheduled for Jan. 3.

Prague Trials Too Much For Card-Holding Red

LONDON (AP) — British composer and conductor Benjamin Frankel announced Friday night he had quit the Communist party after 12 years as a cardholding member because of "revulsion" against the recent Prague purge trials and executions.

In a public letter of resignation addressed to London's Communist newspaper, the Daily Worker, Frankel said: "The taking, in this idle way, of human life... is too strong to be stomachable."

The Worker did not print the letter.

Frankel, 46, wrote and arranged some of the score for the British movie hit, "The Seventh Veil."

Wife's Writing Gets Cub Scribe Hot Interview

KANELOHE, Hawaii (AP) — A cub reporter's dream came true Friday night — he dined with President-elect Eisenhower and Secretary of State-designate John Foster Dulles.

It all happened because Gordon Morse's pretty young wife Jo Ann likes to write letters. And she felt sorry for the general.

Morse started his first newspaper job with the Honolulu Advertiser two weeks ago, fresh out of school.

Jo Ann wrote to Eisenhower aboard the cruiser Helena 10 days ago. She told him that if he was tired of politics and making speeches "drop in for a home cooked dinner."

"Make our home your home during your stay in Hawaii," she wrote.

At the time Eisenhower was en route home from his historic tour of Korea.

His aide called the Morses last night and invited them to dinner. They came, stayed for nearly three hours of dinner and high-level conversation and departed.

Interviewed by working reporters at the gate, Morse acted like a trouper.

"No comment," he said.

Helen Keller Demands Retraction Of Statement

WASHINGTON (AP) — Helen Keller, famous blind and deaf author-educator, has called on a Czechoslovakian newspaper to retract a story in which it said she endorsed the Communist-run Vienna "peace" conference.

The State Department said yesterday Miss Keller, a leader in efforts to aid the blind, had repudiated the story in a Voice of America broadcast to Czechoslovakia.

The Prague newspaper Rude Pravo reported Dec. 6 Miss Keller said, "I am with you in your wonderful movement with all my heart."

Actually, Miss Keller a few days earlier had assailed the Vienna congress as "a mask for the furtherance of Stalinist propaganda."

Weeks Expects Business To Hold At High Level

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sinclair Weeks, tapped as the next secretary of commerce, says he expects business to be good after defense spending tapers off.

The Boston industrialist-politician told reporters yesterday he also thinks private capital should replace government funds in foreign aid, the excess profits tax should be junked and caution should be used in cutting tariffs.

Man Of 84 Arrested As Bookie Suspect

CHICAGO (AP) — Police Capt. Kyran Phelan Thursday arrested a little old man whom he described as the busiest person in the lobby of the Cook County Building—selling bets on horse races.

He identified the man as Joseph Friedman, 84, who was charged with accepting bets.

Phelan said Friedman was one of the oldest bookie suspects ever arrested in Chicago. He said Friedman had 46 betting stubs in his pocket.

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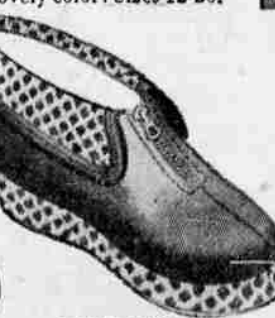
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
