Fathers, Korean Vets To Escape Draft, Anna Says

WASHINGTON — The lady boss of U. S. military personnel says the armed forces can meet their manpower needs for the next year and a half with only a minor tightening of draft rules.

Mrs. Anna Rosenberg, assistant secretary of defense in charge of personnel, said Sunday night the Defense Department plans to keep its present strength of 3,600,000 men and women through June, 1954, without drafting fathers or Korean veterans.

She told television interviewers (NBC) this could be done through a draft of 620,000 from the selective service pool in the year beginning next July 1. The armed services will discharge 1,100,000 during the year, she said, and the balance can be met through volunteer enlistments.

"We will probably have to tighten some of our administrative rulings," she added, "such as a man who has a student deferment during that time becomes a father and asks for a deferment on that basis—well, we don't believe that's quite a justifiable deferment."

Mrs. Rosenberg agreed with questioners that the armed forces are not making full use of their manpower. But she said the military is as efficient as big business, considering that the military does not have as wide a choice of its workers and has only two years to train and use them.

Kaltenborn Says Scribes Caused Truman Outburst

NEW YORK — News Commentator H. V. Kaltenborn said Friday night that reporters were more responsible than President Truman for what he called the President's "ill-tempered" remarks concerning President-elect Eisenhower and Gen. Douglas MacArthur.

He said in an NBC broadcast heard across the nation that the President "should not permit himself to be trapped into indiscretions by clever appeals to his personal prejudices."

Kaltenborn suggested that Eisenhower might be wise to require questions to be submitted in advance in writing in the manner that questions are asked of the Prime Minister in the British House of Commons.

The radio commentator referred to Truman's news conference Thursday in which the President described Eisenhower's Korean trip as demagoguery and blasted MacArthur on several grounds.

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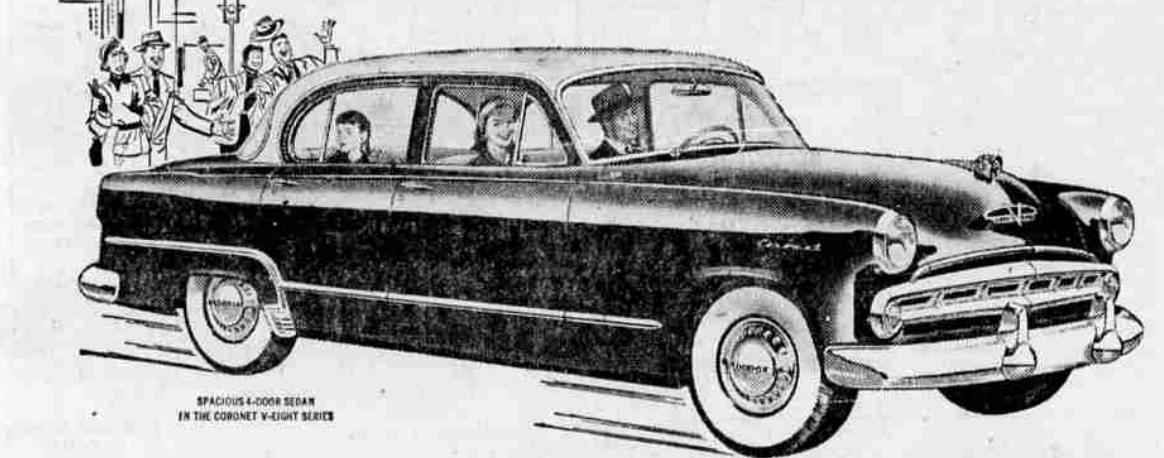

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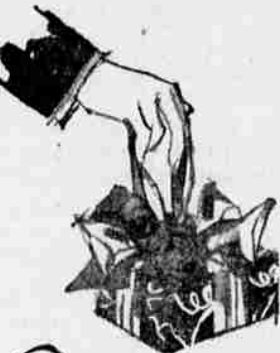
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55 MINERS TRAPPED
