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Three Children Deserted In Hall

CHICAGO (AP)—Three young children, two boys and a girl, were found huddled in a hallway in a South Side home late Friday night, presumably left there by one of their parents. Medicine for the youngest child and a shopping bag filled with clean clothes were left with the children.

The children's crying awakened a tenant, who called police.

Police found a small bottle of medicine in an envelope. Written on the envelope was this message: "This is for Eugene's gums. He's cutting teeth and he (sic) awfully crabby. Don't spank him."

Police at Woodlawn Station learned that Eugene was "Buddy," the youngest boy, about two years old. The second boy, Richard, about 4, told police the girl's name was "Mickey," who is about 3. Richard was unable to further identify himself or the other two children. All were warmly dressed. They were found in the hallway of a home at 6901 South Prairie Avenue in the Woodlawn district.

The three tots entertained themselves at the police station while po-

lice searched for their parents. Richard banged on a typewriter. Buddy played with a slate. Mickey, blond and blue eyed, played with a small kitten found in the station. Later Buddy was taken to St. Vincent's Orphanage and Richard and Mickey to the juvenile home.

Chinese Reds Release Clergyman In Chains

HONG KONG (AP)—Father Si-card Daniel of Colombia, South America, crossed the border into Hong Kong Sunday in chains. He was expelled by the Chinese Communists after a public trial on charges of beating a Chinese man. Father Daniel said he spent 13 months in jail, handcuffed by the Reds in an effort to prevent him from praying before meals. He was forced to squat on the cement floor of his jail and was given only two bowls of rice daily.

Sparkman Says Ike's Korea Trip Was 'Good Thin'

NEW DELHI, India (AP)—Sen. Sparkman (D-Ala.) told Indian newsmen Saturday he does not believe a conservative wave of reaction will sweep the United States when the Eisenhower administration assumes power.

The defeated vice-presidential candidate, on a world tour, arrived here in a British jet liner from Karachi, making the trip from the Pakistan capital in 40 minutes. "Generally the Republicans are regarded as more conservative than the Democrats but I fear no great wave of reaction," he said. "Nor do I expect our basic foreign policy to be changed."

Sparkman said he believed President-elect Eisenhower's Korean trip was "probably a very good thing," but he made no prediction of immediate results.

The senator will leave here by plane Sunday for Calcutta and will return to the United States via Bangkok, Hong Kong and Tokyo. He expects to be home for Christmas.

In New Delhi he conferred with U. S. and Indian officials and visited a community project village established with the aid of U. S. funds.

Lower Prices Draw Index Figure Down

WASHINGTON (AP)—Lower prices for cattle, lambs, live poultry and cotton and sharper drops in eggs and some fruits and vegetables pulled government-measured wholesale prices down four-tenths of 1 per cent during the week ended last Tuesday.

The Bureau of Labor Statistics said yesterday the over-all drop in wholesale prices was due mainly to a 2 1/2 per cent decline in farm products.

The bureau said its index of prices dropped to 190.6 per cent of the 1947-49 average.

State Sheriffs Play Washington State Board

WALLA WALLA (AP)—The state's sheriffs played members of the State Board of Prison Terms and Paroles Friday as "theorists" from ivy covered towers who know nothing of criminal problems and tendencies.

The attack came at a meeting of the Washington State Sheriffs' Association. No individual member of the board was mentioned by name, but the entire group was accused of failing to cooperate with peace officers in setting terms of criminals and granting their release from prison.

The association demanded that in the future one member of the board be a law enforcement officer.



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
