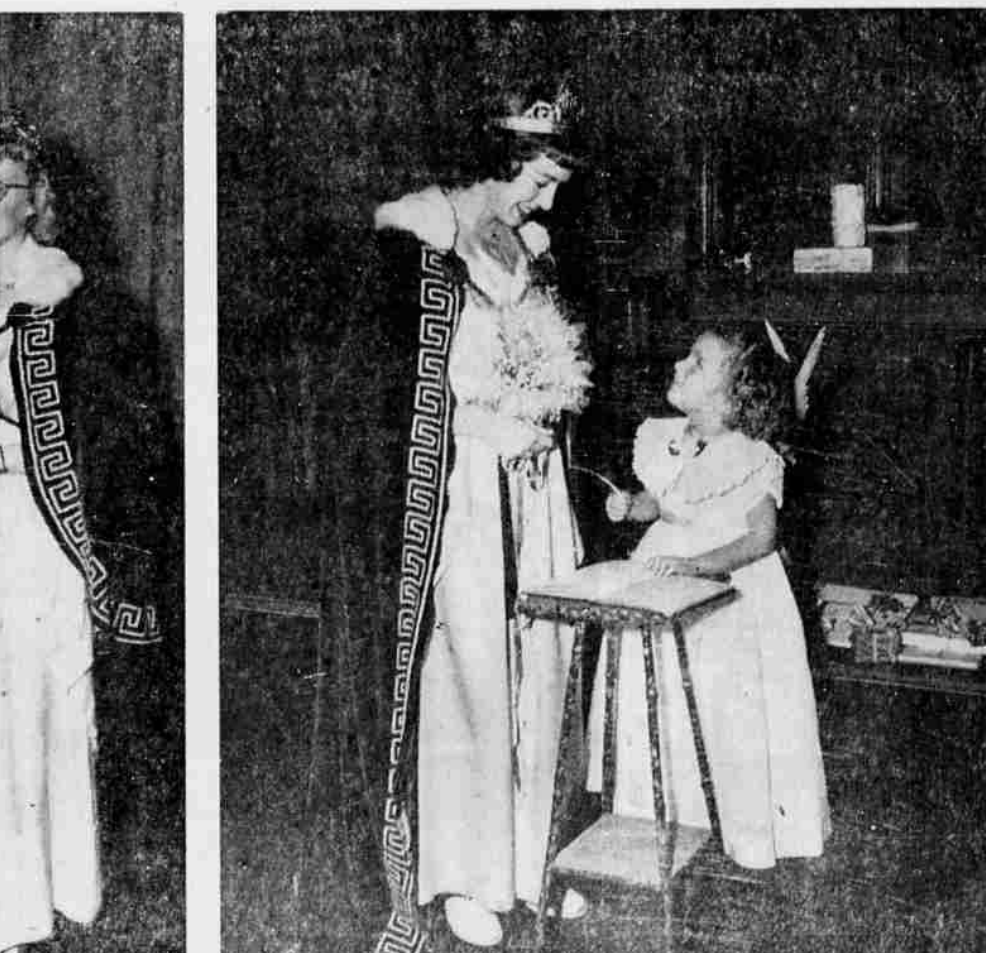
Mrs. Proctor held high score with Mrs. Huff winning the consolation favor.
