Suspended Union Man Convicted Of Bribery

NEW YORK (AP) — George (Muscles) Futterman, suspended union representative, has been convicted of bribing a witness to lie in the murder trial last year of Benito Macri.

A General Sessions jury found Futterman guilty Friday night of subordination of perjury and bribery of a witness, Samuel Blum-

enthal. Macri was acquitted last year of a charge he participated in the fatal stabbing in New York City on May 9, 1949, of William Lurie, an organizer for the AFL International Ladies Garment Workers Union.

OAKS CAPTURE GLENDALE WIN

The Oakland Oaks continued to ride the victory trail Saturday night, defeating the Glendale Pirates, 65-40, at the Oakland High School gym.

Fordham Thinks Of Dropping College Football

NEW YORK (AP) — Announcement that Fordham is considering abandonment of intercollegiate football re-emphasized today the depths to which the sport has fallen in the metropolitan New York area.

Fans in the nation's largest city, which provides the pulsebeat of other major sports, now quite blandly accept the fact that college football here is strictly minor league. Hopes of any improvement are bleak.

New York University, which reached great heights under John F. Chuck Meehan back in the roaring '20s, now plays a second-rate schedule. Columbia is one of the door mats of the Ivy League. Fordham is talking de-emphasis and possible resignation.

The best record of these three main New York teams during the past season was two victories, and all shared that.

Fordham won 2, lost 5 and tied 1 game. NYU had a 2-5-1 record also while Columbia finished with an even poorer over-all mark of 2-6-1. All together, they won 6, lost 16, tied 3.

The Rev. Vincent Hart, director of university development, revealed yesterday Fordham lost approximately \$50,000 during the past season and has a \$200,000 deficit for a seven-year period.

After two postponements because of training injuries, Dykes bowed out of the picture and Micelo was brought in as a sub. Micelo was granted a delay for more training time and then a fourth postponement was granted Turner because of a chin cut sustained in training.

Ban Of Telecast Likely In Month

WASHINGTON (AP) — A move to ban telecasts of boxing bouts in cities where the fights originate is likely to be made next month when the National Boxing Association opens discussions of the impact of TV on the sport.

NBA president George A. Barton said Sunday a resolution urging a local blackout will be introduced at a Jan. 10-11 meeting in New York of the NBA executive committee.

Abe J. Greene, National NBA Commissioner, said boxing has more followers than ever before but the public has begun to expect fights on home TV sets.

"That has just about killed all small clubs, and TV has cut its own supply lines," he said.

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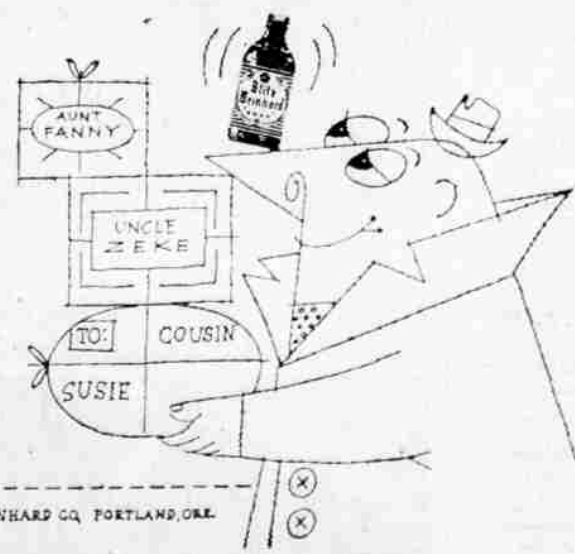
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
