

GI's, Germans To Eat Christmas Dinner Together

FRANKFURT, Germany (AP)—Thousands of Germans and American GIs will eat Christmas dinner together in what has become an annual postwar gesture of friendship.

Germans are inviting the soldiers to share dinner with them on their homes on Christmas Day. Many Americans have asked their German friends to eat the big yuletide meal with them.

The Army is making it possible for GIs to invite their German friends to have dinner in Army mess halls. The dinner, which the soldiers have for, will include turkey and all the trimmings.

At the big U.S. airbase at Wiesbaden, airmen chipped in \$3,000 to throw a big Christmas party for 350 German children. Money left over will be used to buy food baskets for needy German families at Bremerhaven will spend it.

An American Christmas committee will provide 3,000 underprivileged German children with toys, fruit, nuts and candy for Christmas.
