SPOKANE (AP)—William G. Oves, a Spokane Chamber of Commerce official since 1917, died here Sunday night after a brief illness.

Oves was manager of the chamber's visitors, convention and publicity bureau at his death. He was to have retired in May 1953.

He also was executive secretary and chairman of the board of directors of the Pacific Northwest Travel Association.

Landslide Buries Whole Village Of 40 Homes

MODENA, Italy (AP)—The little 40-dwelling village of Caselle was wiped out Tuesday night by a huge, slow moving landslide three-quarters of a mile wide.

There was no loss of life. The 300 inhabitants had been evacuated as the mass of rock and rain-loosened dirt rolled down on the village at a rate of 50 feet an hour during the past three days.

Before the landslide, walls cracked and buildings crumbled.

Listing Ship Loses 600,000 Ft. Of Lumber

COOS BAY (AP)—The steamship Karen Olson lost 600,000 board feet of lumber when it suddenly listed to a 50-degree angle after leaving the Coos Bay harbor Saturday.

After losing its deck cargo, the ship righted itself to a 20-degree list and was able to proceed south along the Oregon Coast.

One of the ship's two boilers failed and water flooded the engine room, Captain Anton Brix radioed.

Nothing Useful Seen In Ike-Stalin Parley

WASHINGTON (AP)—Sen. Fulbright (D-Ark.) says he doubts anything useful would come of a Churchill-Stalin-Eisenhower meeting right now because Russia's aim is to bleed and divide the West.

But we "must not take the attitude that there is no hope and refuse to meet with them," Fulbright said.

Fredricks is serving a 15-year sentence on a Multnomah County assault conviction.

Draft May Skip College Students, Dads For 2 Years

ST. LOUIS (AP)—Robert C. Goodwin, executive director of the Labor Department's defense manpower administration, predicted Monday the military draft exemption of college students and fathers probably can be continued for at least two more years.

Goodwin told a conference of scientific manpower here the extension would be possible, however, only if military manpower needs do not increase greatly.

"Labor Department projections of the military manpower pool," Goodwin said, "indicate deferment of students and fathers can remain in effect at least two more years without impairing the Selective Service System."

The deferment of "competent students" in science and engineering should continue, he added, even if an emergency requires severe curtailment of other deferments.

Goodwin said more than one million men between the ages of 18 and 28 have been granted dependency deferments, and about 180,000 students and 100,000 agricultural workers have been deferred.
