Bomb, Dynamite Found Under Span

TRAIL, B. C. (AP) — A homemade time bomb, housed in a cardboard carton, was found under a railway bridge on the outskirts of Trail. It had a clock-work timing device and was built around 30 sticks of dynamite. RCMP officers said Tuesday the timing mechanism had failed, but declined to elaborate. Two boys found the bomb under a CPR bridge close to their Warfield village home. They thought it was a wireless set and took it home. The father of one of the lads discovered it and called police. Recently representatives of rail unions protested to the B. C. government against Doukhobor terrorism in the Kootenays and asked for guards to protect trains and railway property. Recently power lines in the Trail-Nelson area were blasted by dynamite explosions.

Heads Of Legislative Committees Named

SALEM (AP) — State Rep. Lee V. Ohmart of Salem will head the House Tax Committee in the new Legislature, Rep. Rudie Wilhelm Jr., Portland, who will be speaker of the House, announced Tuesday. Rep. Mark Hatfield, also of Salem, will be chairman of the important State and Federal Affairs Committee. Wilhelm said that Rep. Robert L. Elstrom, Salem, who resigned as chairman of the State Liquor Commission to run for the Legislature, will serve on the House Alcoholic Control Committee, which will draft the regulations for sale of liquor by the drink.
