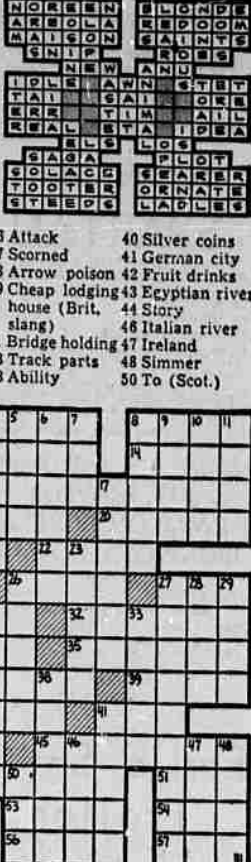

Medford Woman Killed By Train-Auto Collision

MEDFORD (AP) — The first Oregon traffic fatality in the Christmas holiday was reported Saturday morning.

In it Mrs. Mark F. Wright, Medford, was fatally injured in a collision of her automobile and a Southern Pacific freight train at a grade crossing in Medford.

ENGINEER KILLED

PORTLAND (AP) — Laurids Lauridsen, 72, an electrical engineer for the Portland Traction Co., was fatally injured Monday when struck by a car as he crossed a street. His death was Portland's 51st in traffic this year.

The city had 47 deaths on the same date a year ago.

Oregon Slayer Again Sentenced To Death

SALEM (AP) — Albert Lee Karnes, 24, Friday was sentenced to death in the state prison gas chamber for the ax slaying of Mrs. Susan L. Chfield, 81, here last June. It was the second time Circuit Judge George R. Duncan had pronounced the death sentence since Karnes' conviction of first degree murder. He was first sentenced to die Oct. 17 but was granted a stay of execution to appeal to the State Supreme Court.

Karnes was arrested at The Dalles.

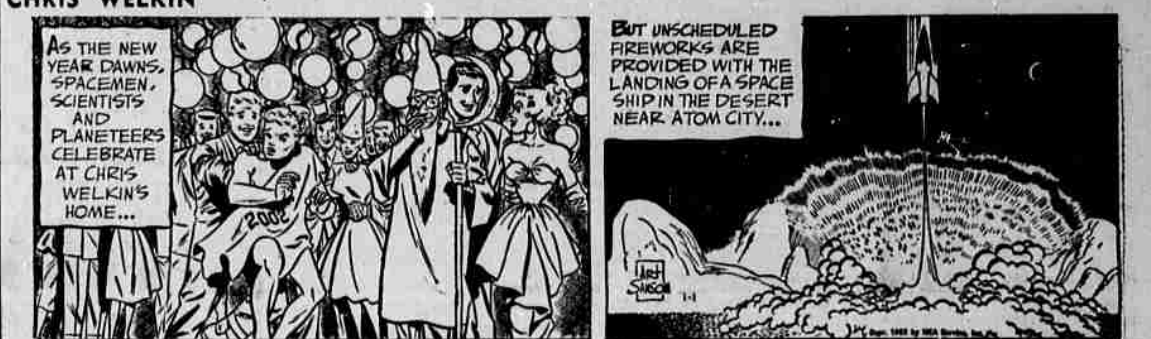

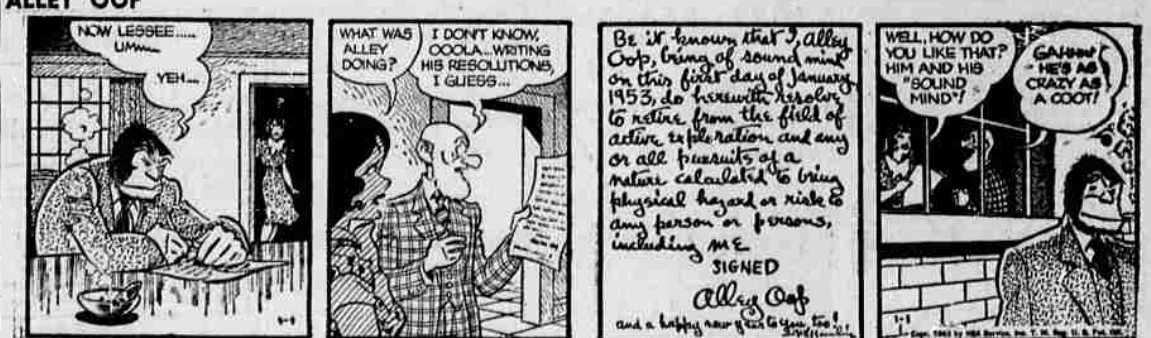
