Two School Buses Crash; Two Killed, 40 Injured

MANNING, S. C. (U.S.A.)—Two school buses, one packed with children, crashed head-on in thick fog near here early Tuesday, killing two and injuring about 40 children.

Thomas Harrison 10, and Willie Lemon, who was driving one bus, died about four hours after the collision.

The injured were rushed to Clarendon Memorial Hospital here in this town of 2,750 fifty miles southeast of Columbia.

Sheriff T. J. Jackson said one bus, empty except for the Negro driver, Lemon, was en route to pick up passengers for a Negro school when it struck the other bus, loaded with about 40 white passengers.

The driver of the white bus was identified as W. H. Ridgway, 15.
