SEOUL, Jan. 29 — Gen. James A. Van Fleet bade 50,000 cheering Koreans a tearful farewell today and promised to return one day to visit the war-ravaged peninsula.

Van Fleet will surrender command of the U. S. Eighth Army to Lt. Gen. Maxwell D. Taylor early next month and leave for the U.S. and retirement. He has led the multi-national Allied army in defense of South Korea since April, 1951.
