HONG KONG (AP) — Exploding firecrackers echoed through the streets Friday as gay crowds awaited a midnight celebration ushering in the year of the snake and ending the year of the dragon.

A holiday air prevailed in anticipation of the Chinese vunar year 4650. Costumed merry-makers exchanged gifts both here and at Taipei, Formosa.

Baskets of red paper flowers and fruits, bright lanterns and gaily decorated bamboo stalls lined Hong Kong streets for the three-day festival which begins Saturday.

Despite the gaiety a survey indicated this year's celebration would be far less extravagant than usual.

Merchants complained of too many window shoppers and too few customers.
