The appearance of the Syracuse football team in the Orange Bowl will mark the first post-season bowl contest for any Syracuse grid squad.

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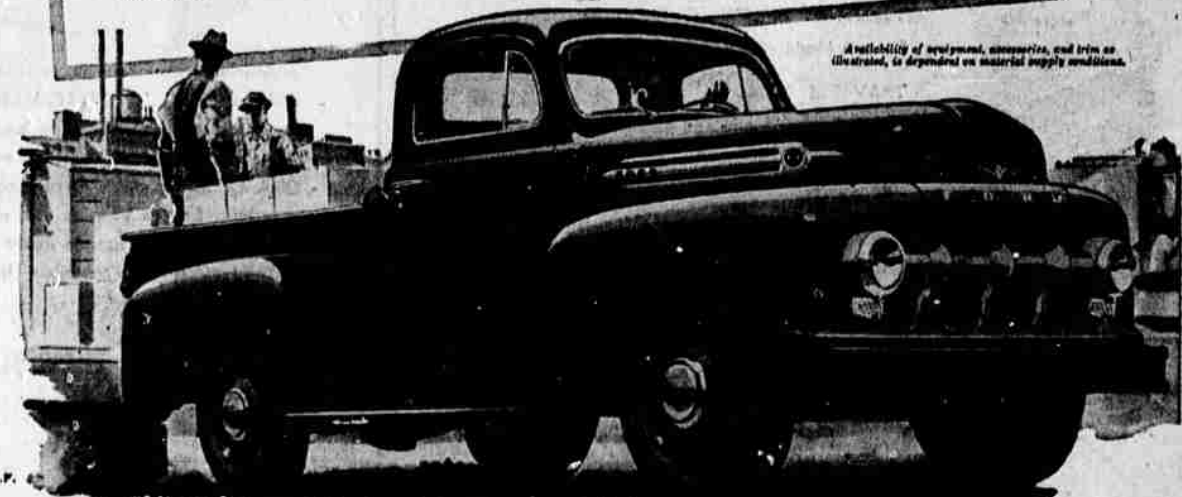


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
