Labor And Management Clash Over New Bills

SALEM — Employers and labor leaders tangled Wednesday afternoon over four employer-introduced bills to restrict labor unions. At a packed hearing before the House Labor and Industries Committee, small businessmen declared that the bills are needed to protect them from what they called excessive influence in trying to sign up their employees.

The labor leaders said the bills are unnecessary, undemocratic, un-Christian and discriminatory. The bills would prohibit picketing in order to sign up employees, allow unions to be sued, and prevent strikes without a vote of the employees.

PROPOSES BUILDING

SALEM — Sen. Dean H. Walker, Independence, chairman of the Senate Ways and Means Committee, proposed Thursday that a building be built here to house the Oregon Historical Society, museums and the Battleship Oregon Commission.

He suggested that the Ways and Means Committee study the idea and report on it in 1955.

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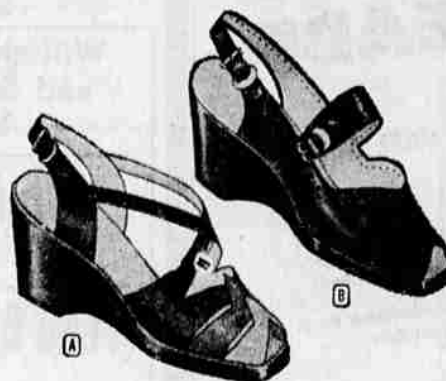
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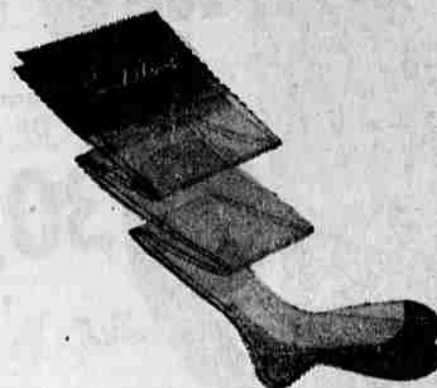
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
