Unemployment In Douglas Drops

The estimated number of unemployed persons in the area of Douglas County serviced by the Roseburg office of the State Unemployment Compensation Commission was fifth highest in the state on April 1.

This was the report released on a statewide basis in a statistical bulletin issued by the Commission. Figures showed an estimated 1,585 unemployed. Some 235 of these were women. But with weather allowing logging operations to pick up, the number of unemployed had dropped by almost 25 percent from March 1 when an estimated 2,000 were out of jobs. But it was still up from the same April 1 date last year when only 1,100 were unemployed.

The bulletin showed, however, that new claims were down in March of this year as compared to 1952. In March 1952, 192 claims were filed in the Roseburg office, but this year only 146 were filed. The weeks claimed and payments made by the Commission, however, far exceeded last year's totals. The March month of 1953 showed 4,009 weeks claimed as compared to 3,279 in 1952 and payments totaling \$100,998 in March of 1953 as compared to \$70,971 in 1952.

Glendale PO Box Costs To Climb After July 1

Postmaster Howard Edson announced this week that Post Office box rental will go up at the beginning of the next quarter, July 1.

Small box rentals will rise from 45 to 60 cents per quarter; medium box rentals from 50 to 75 cents and postal drawers will be raised from 75 cents to \$1. According to Edson, box rentals depend on gross postal receipts and corresponding classifications of the post offices involved. Local gross receipts in 1952 were \$12,213.78 for postage stamps sold, and the increase is mandatory where receipts are in excess of \$10,000.

The number of boxes in the Glendale Post Office is 353, and 108 more are ordered and will arrive for installation in the very near future.

TO OPEN NEW PLANT
