

U. S. Ships Home First Repatriates Out Of Trieste

TRIESTE (AP)—The United States shipped home Tuesday the first boatload of wives and children of the troops America says it is going to withdraw from disputed Trieste.

Several hundred Trieste citizens and American soldiers waved farewell as the 250 dependents sailed on the U.S. troopship Geiger.

Their departure underlined apparent British-American determination to go through with the announced plan to turn Trieste's Zone

over to Italy despite threats by Yugoslav President Tito to march his own forces into the zone if the Italians come in.

The Allied troops are scheduled to leave next month.

Pro-American sentiment in the city reached an emotional peak Monday night at a concert given by the 98th U.S. Army band at Allied headquarters. More than 800 local persons packed the auditorium and several hundred more lined up outside.

When an American speaker began, "I believe this will be the last concert in Trieste of the Army band," the audience roared. "No, no, let the Americans stay."

\$50,000 Robbery Sets Record In Spokane

SPOKANE (AP)—Two men held up the Low Cost Market here Sunday and escaped with \$50,000—possibly the largest armed robbery haul, detectives said, in the city's history.

The men, both red-headed, pulled a gun on a check girl after buying soap and corn flakes, then forced other employees to clean out the safe, loaded the money in bags and carry them to a car parked outside the supermarket.

Police said customers in the store did not realize a hold up was taking place.

Spittoon Removal Bids Asked By Uncle Sam

VANCOUVER, Wash. (AP)—The Vancouver postmaster issued a call Monday for bids to remove seven spittoons from the post-office.

He said he wanted to get rid of the spittoons, which no longer are needed, and that a formal call for bids is required for disposal of government property.

The bids will be opened Oct. 28.
