

NAMED BISHOP

WILLIAMSBURG, Va. (AP) — The Rt. Rev. Russell Sturgis Hubbard, suffragan bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Michigan, Thursday was elected bishop of the Missionary District of Spokane, Wash.

Bishop Hubbard, a native of Philadelphia, is 51. He is a nephew of a former presiding bishop of the Episcopal Church, the Rt. Rev. James Dewolf Perry.

Sierra Nevadas Underlined By Huge Basaltic Formation

COLUMBUS, O. (AP) — Earthquake waves which lag a little behind schedule have supplied evidence that California's Sierra Nevada mountains are standing upon a massive foundation of basaltic rock 30 to 40 miles deep, a widely known seismologist reported Thursday.

Waves from earth movements originating west of the Sierra reach stations east of the range anywhere from 2 1/4 to 4 seconds later than they should if they were traveling a straightaway course, said Prof. Perry Byerly, University of California seismologist. His report was prepared for delivery before the Institute of Geodesy, Photogrammetry and Cartography.

This means they detour downward to pass under the vast foundation rock mass on their way through the earth's crust, Prof. Byerly said. The time lag in arriving at stations east of the Sierra is a measure of this detour and consequently gives an idea of the size of the rock mass.

Quakes centering near Eureka, in far Northern California, lag 4 seconds in reaching Tinemaha station in Owens Valley on the east side of the range near the southern end of the Sierra. From Eureka to Reno the delay is about 2 1/4 seconds.

The earthquake wave lag thus supports other evidence of the existence of this big rock mass, Prof. Byerly said.

Byerly first advanced the idea of the rock foundation in 1938. Minute changes in the gravitational pull of the earth near the Sierra gave the first physical clue to the existence of the basalt mass.

It took several years of earthquake recordings to produce the new evidence. They indicate the entire Sierra range is underlain with this enormous basaltic foundation, Byerly reported.

Origin Of Fish Determination Said Important

WASHINGTON (AP) — Delegate Bartlett (D-Alaska) said Thursday it is "imperative" that the United States begin investigations to determine the origin of fish in North Pacific waters.

Bartlett told Secretary of the Interior McKay in a letter that he was gratified to learn the department is requesting funds to finance such a study by the Fish and Wildlife Service.

Under the North Pacific fishery agreement reached by this country, Canada and Japan, fishermen of the latter nation agreed not to fish in North American waters. Japanese fishermen, under the convention, must fish west of a line running through the Aleutian Islands.

The Japanese also agreed to move further west if biological investigations proved that some of the fish found within their fishing area originated in North American waters.

Bartlett told McKay that many American fishermen believe Japanese fishing expeditions took salmon this year which had their origin in Alaska streams.

"Under existing circumstances," he wrote the secretary, "there is no way to prove or disprove this. The treaty is clear in respect to an intention on the part of all three nations to protect fishing stocks of national origin."

"Since the United States has most at stake and since it is the Japanese fishermen who approach our home waters instead of vice versa, it is beyond all doubt of utmost importance that we gather essential data."

Senator Says Communists Helping Build U. S. Bases

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Case (R-SD) said Thursday French and British Communists are helping build U.S. air bases abroad, but there has been no sabotage and none is expected.

"There is no way to screen out Communist workers in England and France on military projects there," he said and added:

"I was told that many of the workers are called Communists but actually are state-socialists. They are there to earn a daily wage and there has been no sabotage."

MUST BEAT REDS

TAIPEH, Formosa (AP) — Generalissimo Chiang Kai-shek said Wednesday Communist Viet Minh forces in Indochina cannot be beaten decisively until their source of supplies—Communist China—goes down to defeat. Chiang told three U.S. newsmen in a rare interview that the whole of China serves as a supply base for Moscow-trained Ho Chi Minh's troops in Indochina.

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Oregon Trapping Season Will Open On Sunday

PORTLAND (AP) — The Oregon trapping season opens Sunday. Those seeking beaver will need to know the boundaries of the open areas. Those seeking mink, otter, muskrat and marten have the whole state to operate in.

The mink and otter season ends Jan. 15. That for beaver, muskrat and marten ends Feb. 15. Licenses are needed.

Most of the cutters are local area residents but some are from California.

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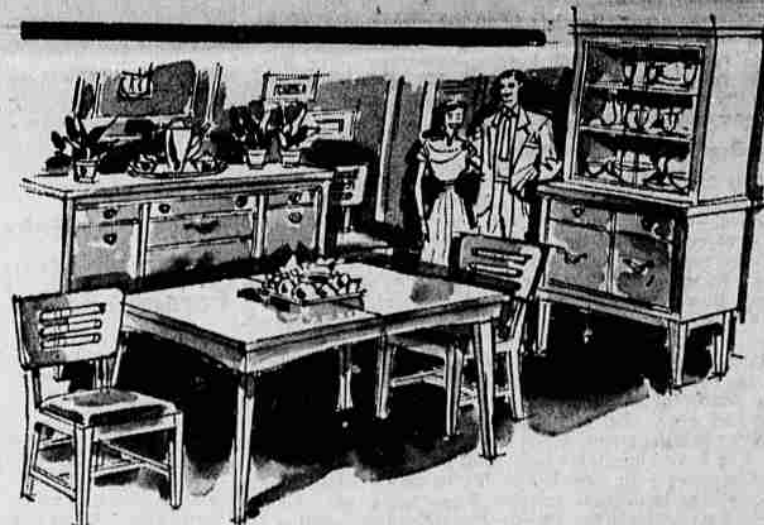


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
