Million Dollars Worth Of Equipment Arrives

PORTLAND (AP) — More than a million dollars worth of turbine governors and associated equipment for The Dalles Dam powerhouse is sought in bids to be opened by the Army Engineers here Jan. 12.

Col. Thomas H. Lipscomb, district engineer, said the bids will cover design, manufacture and testing of 14 sets of turbine governing equipment for 123,800 horsepower turbine units and two sets of equipment for 18,800 horsepower units.

The governors will be on both the main and the fishwater turbines.

Completion dates range from July 1, 1956 to May 1, 1960.

Medical Advances Aim Now Disease Prevention

CHICAGO (AP) — The president of the American Medical Assn. said Thursday that society is "passing through a golden era of tremendous medical advances" and is "headed for a future in which the doctor of medicine will devote most of his time to disease prevention."

Dr. Edward J. McCormick of Toledo, Ohio, told delegates to a convention of the National Society for Crippled Children and Adults:

"Research workers are making magnificent progress in all fields. Spectacular devices such as the mechanical heart and lung and the mechanical kidney demonstrate man's ability to ferret out the long-hidden secrets of the human body. Operations upon the heart, the brain, the lungs and the stomach and other vital organs, impossible 25 years ago, are now being accomplished with safety and success."

Rock Bottom Reached In Movie Decline

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Rock bottom has been reached in the decline of movie production, the directors of the AFL Screen Actors Guild predict.

The guild, representing 8,000 actors, pledged at its annual meeting Tuesday to wage a continuing fight against the inroads of runaway foreign picture production and to do all in its power to promote additional production in this country.

Oregon Has 102 Firms Classed As Seasonal

SALEM (AP) — Oregon has 102 firms classed this year as seasonal by the Oregon Unemployment Compensation Commission. There were 101 last year, and 141 in 1950.

Only one of the firms is in the logging and lumber business. Forty-seven are in food preserving. Employees of seasonal firms can't draw unemployment benefits during periods in which operations drop down to less than 45 per cent of normal.

RAF Transport Plane Crashes Off Singapore

SINGAPORE (AP) — An RAF Valletta transport plane with six persons aboard was believed to have crashed into the sea or jungle after taking off from here Wednesday in bad weather.

An RAF spokesman said the plane had broken radio contact with Changi Airfield 14 minutes after taking off. Six British Lincoln bombers, two other Valettas, and a Sunderland flying boat searched 1,000 square miles of sea and jungle until dusk.
