Bryce, who is in the Armed Service serving in Europe was sent for and is expected to arrive at his father's bedside any day.

Washington — The Army announced Friday that about 4,000 men now listed as missing in action in Korea will be declared "presumed dead" in January if there is no new information about them by then.

As of now, the Army lists the number of its missing in Korea as about 6,300.

The other 2,300 have been missing less than a year or else the Army has some report, not yet fully explored, to indicate the possibility they are alive.

Washington — The Interstate Commerce Commission Friday authorized increases in the parcel post rates on catalogues, similar printed advertising matter and controlled circulation publications.

The advances in the catalogue and advertising matter group will amount to about 17 per cent. The rates on controlled circulation publications will be hiked about 10 per cent.

The latter publications are principally trade and technical publications circulated without a subscription charge to specialized groups.
