**Mary Christmas Finds It Just A Bit Confusing**

LAWRENCEVILLE, Ill. — Mary Christmas, a Lawrenceville school teacher who was born near Santa Claus, Ind., is having her usual happy time around the holidays. But, as always during the Christmas period, Mary says she is a little "mixed up."  
 "I get mixed up around the holidays," Mary Christmas said "because I never know if people are calling me or just giving holiday greetings."  
 Miss Christmas, 34, said that when she's introduced to people, "they always answer, 'Yeah, and call me Happy New Year or Fourth of July.'"  
 "I've heard those jokes over and over, but if they stopped I'd almost be disappointed."  
 Miss Christmas, in years past, sent holiday greeting cards which read: "Merry Christmas from Mary Christmas," or "Happy New Year — Mary Christmas."  
 Miss Christmas, who was born on a farm near Poseyville, Ind., about 50 miles from Santa Claus, insists her parents "didn't realize what they had done" when they named their only daughter Mary.  
 "They took my first and middle names from my grandparents who were named Grace and Mary," she explains, adding: "Mary just happened to come out first."

**Color Telecast, But No Receiving Sets Yet In Use**

WASHINGTON — A flurry of color television broadcasts is starting since the Federal Communications Commission told the networks to go ahead — but there won't be many sets to receive the full-hued pictures for a while.  
 The FCC has told the industry it could proceed at once with color telecasts, even though a formal order approving a new color system will not become effective for 30 days.  
 The National Broadcasting Company promptly announced plans to telecast in color the opera "Amahl and the Night Visitors" Sunday and other programs during the coming holiday season.  
 Columbia Broadcasting System said it would continue telecasting its specially authorized color program "The New Review" on Fridays and start additional ones next year.  
 But industry sources in New York said that only a few programs in a few key cities will be broadcast regularly by late spring or summer and by the end of 1954 there still will not be many thousand color receivers in use — at \$700 to \$1500 each. Mass production and substantially lower prices, they indicated, may be two years away.  
 The approved system, however, permits black and white reception of color broadcasts on existing sets.

**Conviction Of Soldier By French Challenged**

WASHINGTON — The secretaries of State and Defense have five days to explain to a federal judge the conviction of a Maryland soldier by a French court on charges of stealing a car.  
 U.S. District Judge David A. Pine yesterday ordered Secretaries Dulles and Wilson to show cause why a writ of habeas corpus should not be issued for Pvt. Richard T. Keefe, 25, of Riverdale, Md. Keefe was sentenced to five years in prison.  
 Keefe's wife, Gladys, 23, obtained the order, contending that an executive agreement between this country and France is illegal.  
 That agreement details circumstances under which American soldiers may be tried in civilian courts of North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) nations. It was completed four days before Keefe's conviction Oct. 31.

**Josephine Adams Denies Communist Party Link**

MAHWAH, N.J. — Miss Josephine Truslow Adams denies she ever served as a link between the White House and Communist Party leader Earl Browder, as government witnesses have testified.  
 In her denial Thursday night, Miss Adams said she was "an obscure and humble artist" and "not a Communist" or "a mysterious cloak and dagger figure."  
 Government witnesses named her Tuesday at a Washington hearing by the Subversive Activities Control Board. John Lautner, onetime Communist Party functionary, said he knew Miss Adams "as a member of the Communist Party" and as the link between the presidential office and Browder.  
 Lautner testified that Browder took orders from the late President Roosevelt and his Cabinet.
