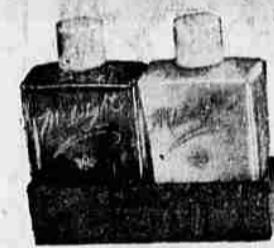

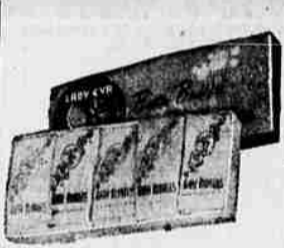

### Charity Racket Probers Plan Control Measures

NEW YORK (AP)—State probers of charity rackets—who have heard revelations ranging from phony solicitations over the telephone from behind closed doors to fake "nuns" begging in public—plan to offer control measures early in the 1954 legislative session.

A joint legislative investigating committee wound up four days of public hearings here Thursday, and plans to hold others later in various parts of the state.

State Sen. Bernard Tompkins, the committee chairman, expressed hope that the disclosure of racketeering and the bonanzas reaped by collectors in some charity drives would not deter the public from giving liberally to honest and well-managed charity and welfare groups.
