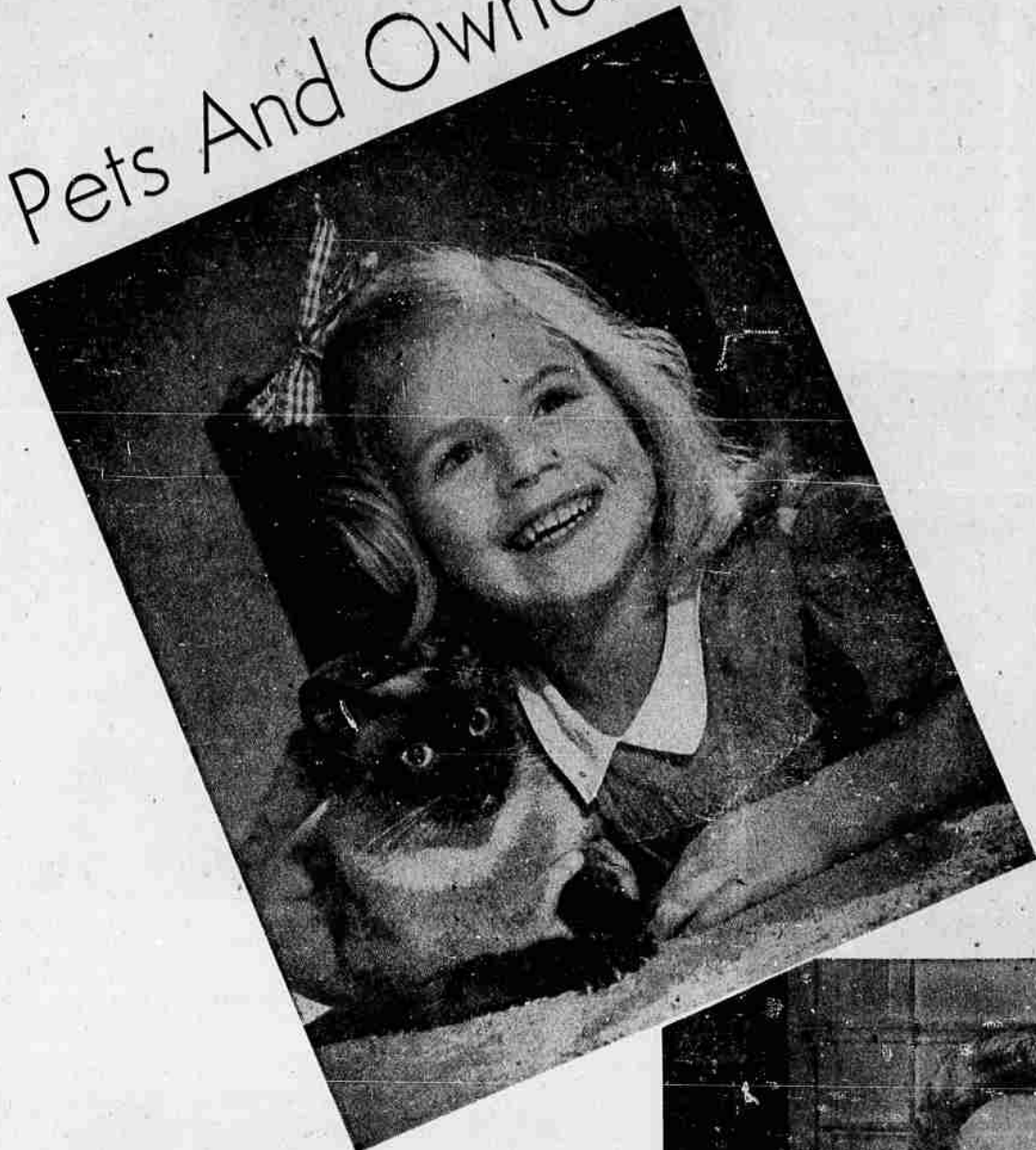


Pets And Owners
