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Bank Records Record Deposit

With a gain of well over 24 million dollars during the past year, the United States National Bank marked up a record deposit total of \$681,816,744 on Dec. 31.

home owned and home operated." The shareholders of the bank are being requested at the annual meeting to be held Jan. 19, to pass upon a proposal to increase the capital stock by 100,000 shares. The proposal would increase the number of shares from 700,000 to 800,000. Capital would be increased by \$2,000,000 bringing it to \$16,000,000. Distribution of the stock dividend would be on the basis of one additional share for each seven held on record Jan. 31.



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Italian Officials Confer On Governmental Crisis

ROME — Alcide de Gasperi, Italy's postwar premier until last summer, conferred with President Luigi Einaudi Friday as the chief of state continued his efforts to resolve Italy's three-day-old political crisis.

De Gasperi, 72-year-old leader of the nation's biggest party—the Christian Democrats, may be called to try once again to form a government. But he declined to comment after his talk with the president.

Einaudi was expected to reach a decision on a premier-designate before next week.

The crisis arose on Tuesday when Premier Giuseppe Pella, another Christian Democrat who succeeded De Gasperi after the indecisive elections last June, quit after five months in office.

Moscow Actors Playing Santa To Russ Kids

MOSCOW — I interviewed Santa Claus in the Kremlin Friday. Santa is called Grandfather Frost here and there turned out to be three of them—all well known Moscow actors taking turns helping entertain thousands of children at huge Fir Tree parties in St. George's Hall of the Kremlin grand palace.

This is the eighth day of a 10-day series of unprecedented parties in the Kremlin. At the rate of 4,000 a day, 32,000 kids already have been entertained amid scenes of former Czarist splendor.

There are two parties daily, each lasting four hours, and people who never dreamed of getting inside the Kremlin now are seeing what Pravda calls "the Soviet peoples' holy of holies."

One of the Santas turned out to be actor Nazvanov, who portrayed Paul Robeson in a production of Robeson's life story. Other Santas were actor Lubimov and Viktor Khokhryakov. The latter is entitled an Artist of the Republic and is a Stalin prize winner.

Western correspondents were admitted to Friday's party and it was something to see thousands of kids trooping through the old Czarist quarters, touching the throne and the Czar's bed.

There was a big concert and variety show and performances by the ballet corps of the Bolshoi Theater. This was followed by the youngsters dancing in the halls where royalty once held balls.

Every kid got a present—a package of oranges and sweets. The oranges were a sensation and most of the kids—and some adults, too—couldn't wait to eat them. They peeled the oranges in the ballroom and tossed the peels in cuspidors in the corners.

Two Southern Counties May Establish Parks

The possibility of establishing Jackson and Josephine county park departments was discussed in Roseburg Friday when Carl Bengston, Grants Pass parks and recreation director, conferred with Charles S. Collins, Douglas County parks supervisor.

Collins said Bengston gathered information with the idea in mind of helping establish parks in the two counties to the south. Collins outlined Douglas County's method of organization, financing and operating procedures.

Douglas County was the first county in Oregon to establish a park department. Since that time, Lane and Crook counties have organized departments. Collins also sent information to Crook County's park commission secretary, Joe Mason, on Friday. Lane County's park supervisor was in Roseburg recently to confer with Collins.
