Vandals, Cougars Set Game Tonight

MOSCOW, Idaho — The Idaho Vandals and Washington State Cougars meet here Tuesday night in a basketball game expected to make a three-way race of the scramble for Northern Division honors.

A win by the Vandals would boost within a half-game of the Oregon Webfoots and Oregon State Beavers, currently tied at the top of the standings, and set the stage for a weekend battle of title contenders—a meeting here with the tall Beavers.

The Vandals, whose 2-2 conference record includes a win and a loss in earlier series with the two leaders, are expected to have little difficulty with the Cougars. The Staters, under Coach Jack Friel, have won one of four conference starts and have a 7-8 overall record.

Coach Chuck Finley will send a team of veterans led by Dwight Morrison against the underdog Cougars, whose mainstay is high scoring forward Ron Ben-nink.

Tuesday night's game is the only one on tap in the league until the weekend when the Beavers play Idaho here and Washington meets Oregon at Eugene.

Indiana Center Posts Two More High Scoring Marks

NEW YORK — At his present pace big Don Schlundt is going to run out of records to break long before he finishes his spectacular basketball career at Indiana University.

The 6-foot-9 center, just approaching the midway point in his junior year, already owns the individual scoring records for many of the Midwest's main basketball arenas. Last night, he added two more prizes to his long string—the Big Ten mark and the record for his home floor at Bloomington. Shooting with amazing accuracy, he scored 47 points as the hurrying Hoosiers ran away from Ohio State 94-72 for their sixth straight conference triumph.

The old Big Ten mark of 43 by Iowa's Dick Ives had stood for 10 years. Schlundt's total was 11 above the former Indiana field-house mark as he connected on 16 field goals in 27 attempts and on 15 of 17 free throw attempts.

Indiana, No. 3 behind Kentucky and Duquesne, was the only member of the nation's top 10 teams in action last night. Three of the second 10 were busy with Maryland, No. 1, whipping Virginia 70-56; Kansas, No. 17, defeating Iowa State 76-61; and Illinois, No. 20, getting beaten by Iowa 79-70.

Wisconsin made 25 of 30 free throws in defeating Michigan State 57-53 in a Big Ten game. Two foul shots by sub Bobby Deloit with seven seconds left gave Tulane a 63-61 Southeastern Conference decision over Tennessee. Davidson surprised Virginia Tech with a second-half spurge that brought a 67-69 Southern Conference victory.

Tulane held Murray State to four points in the final 15 minutes in scoring a 61-51 overtime verdict. Whomling climbed into a tie with Colorado A&M in the Skyline Conference by edging New Mexico 56-53. West Texas State took over the lead in the Border Conference with its fourth in a row, 67-60 over New Mexico A&M.

Tulane's triumph over Tennessee put the Green Wave in third place in the Southeastern behind

Louisiana State and Kentucky as Vanderbilt stumbled before Mississippi 78-74.

Rice moved back into contention in the Southwest Conference by beating Arkansas 80-55, and Texas Christian defeated Baylor 73-60. Bradley rolled over Houston 86-71. Seton Hall made the poorest defensive showing of its basketball history in bowing to John Carroll 94-86.

Fowls are dead easy to "hypnotize." Simply lay a chicken on its back quickly and then hold it gently but firmly until the muscles gradually relax as you loosen your hold. The customary use of chalk is not necessary.

Many a hunter, of course, has watched a bird dog trainer tuck a pigeon's head under its wing and "plant" it for the dogs to find.

A rabbit may be "frozen" by simply confining it to a narrow cage and then pressing it lightly but steadily on its head. A mouse or rat, too, can be affected by quickly and sharply seizing either foot or tail and then pressing it sharply with tweezers. By inverting a guinea pig with a quick movement from a prone to a supine position, it can be rendered immobile at once and it may remain in that uncomfortable stance for two hours.

As many a boy knows, lizards are easy to "put under." It's a matter of flipping the lizard over on its back. To add a deft but unnecessary touch, some junior magicians stroke the chest.

With the same treatment, a "spell" can be cast on a frog leaving it stretched out on its back, feet rigid.

When quickly placed on their backs in a vessel filled with water, many fish remain motionless. For that matter, a fishing companion taught me how to make easy work of landing heavy steelhead trout. He simply placed his plan under the hooked steelhead and lifted it gently out of the water. Accommodatingly, it remained motionless.

Insects too can be shocked quite easily. When next you see a potato beetle munching away contentedly, touch the leaf he is sitting on ever so lightly. At once, he will lose his grip and drop like a pebble and be as inert as a clod. The male of a certain spider pinches his much stronger and larger bride whereby she is rendered motionless—and perhaps well that he does so because many

of the writers' association is secondary. He's the publicity man for the Los Angeles Angels, arch rivals of Hollywood.

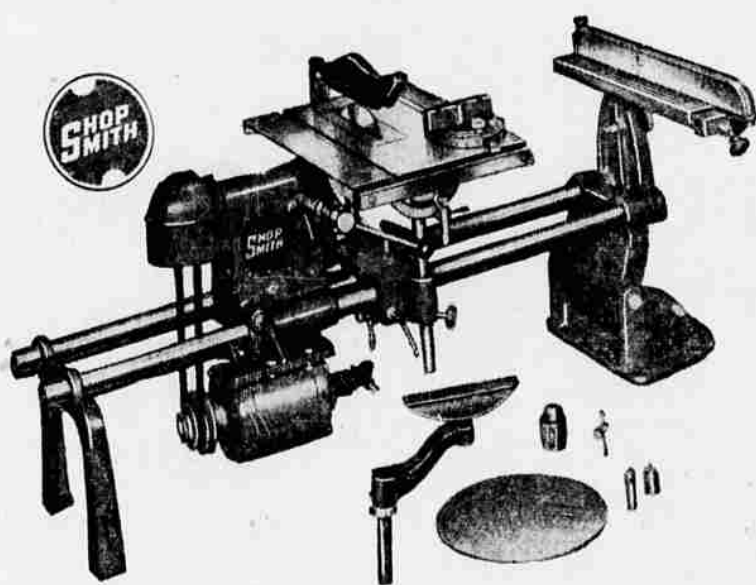
PIONEERS FOLD
